BLAST WRECKS GERMAN VESSEL IN OSLO HARBOR

STOCKHOLM, Dec. 21 - (AP) - Oslo was shaken today by exploding ammunition thrown into the city by the blowing up of a German munitions ship in the harbor 24 hours earlier.

The explosion occurred at 2:30 p. m. yesterday while the Germans were unloading the munitions ship. Thousands of persons were thrown to the ground or shaken by the blast.


Altho there was widespread speculation whether sabotage was responsible, and many Norwegians feared reprisals, German authorities were quoted as saying the explosion was "pure accident."

LT. IVARY GIVEN HIGH PRAISE FOR PACIFIC FIGHT

KENTON, Dec. 21 - Rev. and Mrs. A. A. Ames have renewed word that their son-in-law, Lt. T. Henry Ivary, has been distinguished as one of the outstanding heroes of World War II.

Lt. Ivary, it was revealed, was with the first wave of Marines to have landed on Tarawa island in the Gilberts and was the sole survivor of that volunteer group.

Within 15 minutes after the landing, he was commanding the battalion, all of the other officers having been killed.

Lt. Ivary was hit five times and kept on fighting. He had bullets and shrapnel in his arms and thighs, and when a Jap hand grenade fell next to him, he kicked it out of the way, thereby saving the lives of five men with him on the spot.

After he was wounded in the right leg, a wound which splintered the leg below the knee, he fell, but kept directing the men and continued firing from the ground.

He is reported as saying: "I had to keep fighting or be killed. The Japs kept coming at us with bayonets and I kept my pistol hot. The Japanese knew they were outnumbered, and could have honorably surrendered to a superior force, but they chose to die."


