Gophers Revive Wrestling; Wisconsin Included Among Its Three Opponents

MINNEAPOLIS — A war casualty two weeks ago, due to lack of coaching personnel, Minnesota's wrestling team has returned to the fighting front for the coming campaign with Stan Hanson at the helm to direct forces. Hanson was appointed by Dr. L. F. Keller to serve as head coach for the mat team of which he was an outstanding member in 1937 and 1938. First call for candidates early last week was answered by 15 men for whom daily workouts started immediately. Uncle Sam's Navy program, as in other sports, contributes rather heavily to the squad roster. Eight of the 15 men now training under Coach Hanson are members of the navy's V-12 program. Two lettermen of a year ago will form the nucleus for this year's squad, headed by Bill Aldworth, of football fame, in the heavyweight division and Nick Karalis competing in the 145-pound class. Other outstanding candidates who have reported are Verne Gagne, another football player, who made a name for himself in high school wrestling circles as a member of the Robbinsdale high school wrestling team winning the 175 pound state title in his junior year and annexing the heavy weight crown in his senior year. Another experienced man, Joe Vodonich has recently reported for drills. He is a former Gopher wrestler at 155 pounds. He is enrolled in the graduate school. Minnesota's opponents for the coming season include Wisconsin, Iowa and Northwestern in the conference, with meets now being arranged with Carleton and Macalaster in local college circles.

New Navy Trainees to Aid Marquette

MILWAUKEE — (U.P.) — New navy trainee recruits to the Marquette University basketball squad from De Pauw and Monmouth were expected to participate today in the final workout before a brief Christmas holiday. Among them were Ed Sadowski, Milwaukee, sharpshooting forward, Dick Pabst and Ralph Schroeder, all of De Pauw. The V-5 trainees from Monmouth were less well known. The players were to resume practice Dec. 28 in preparation for their New Year's eve game against Camp Grant at the Milwaukee Auditorium. Wisconsin was billed for a return engagement with Notre Dame in the second half of the doubleheader program.

Sunset Village Will Hold Party

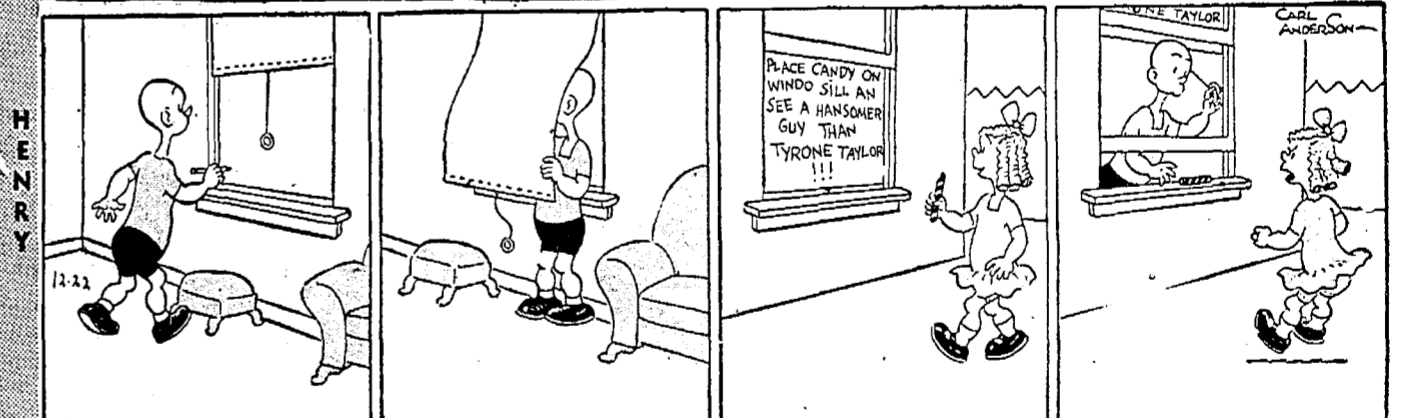
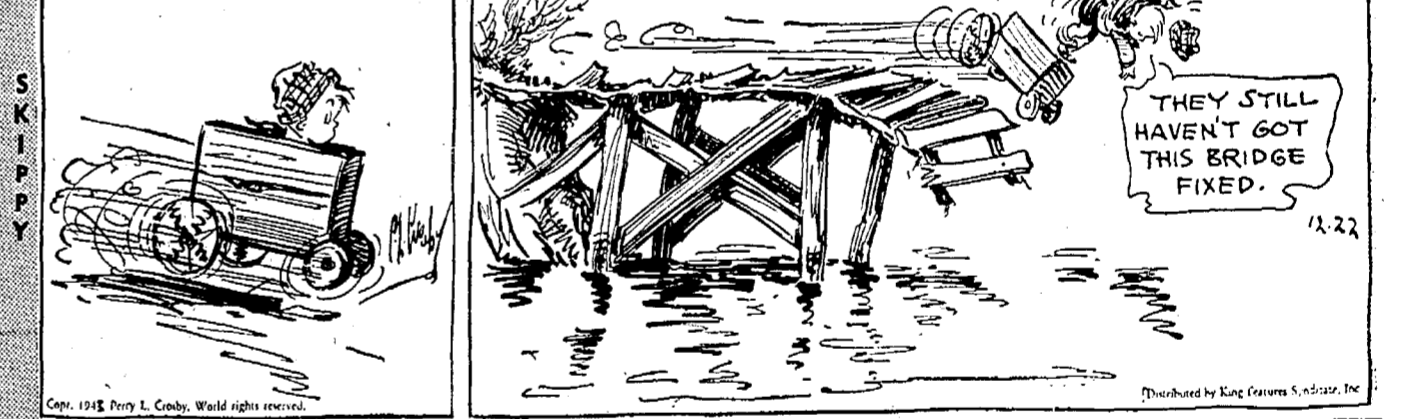
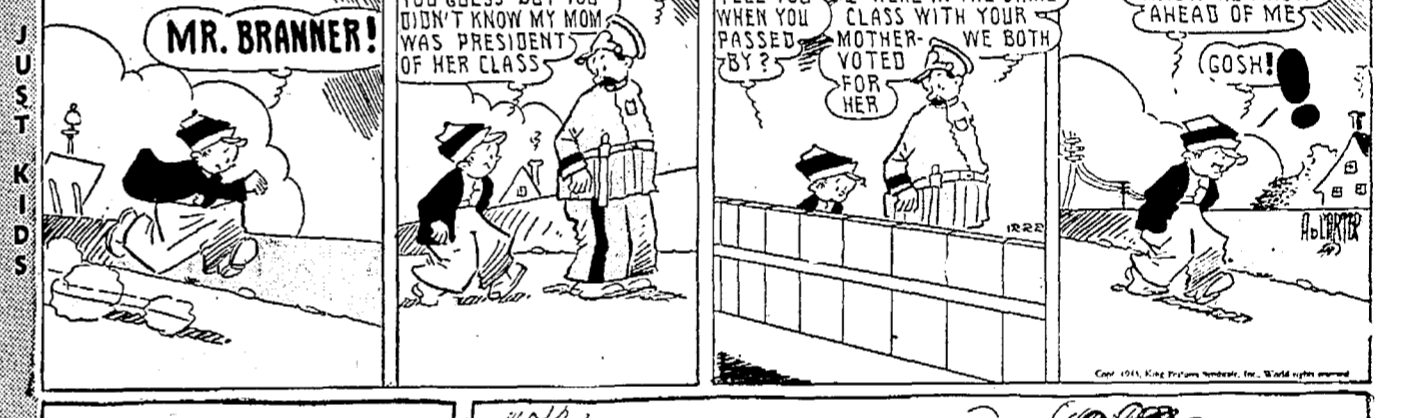
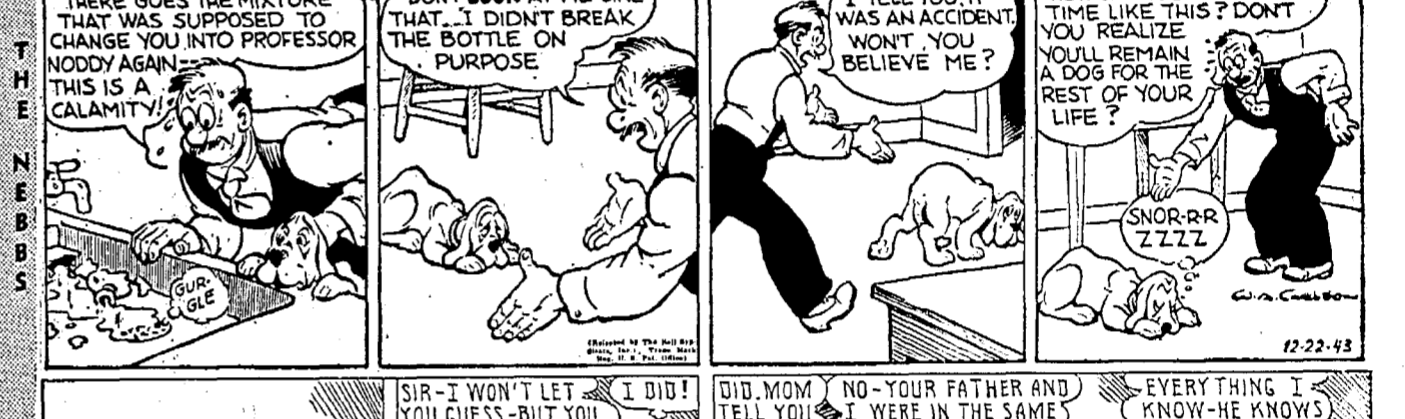
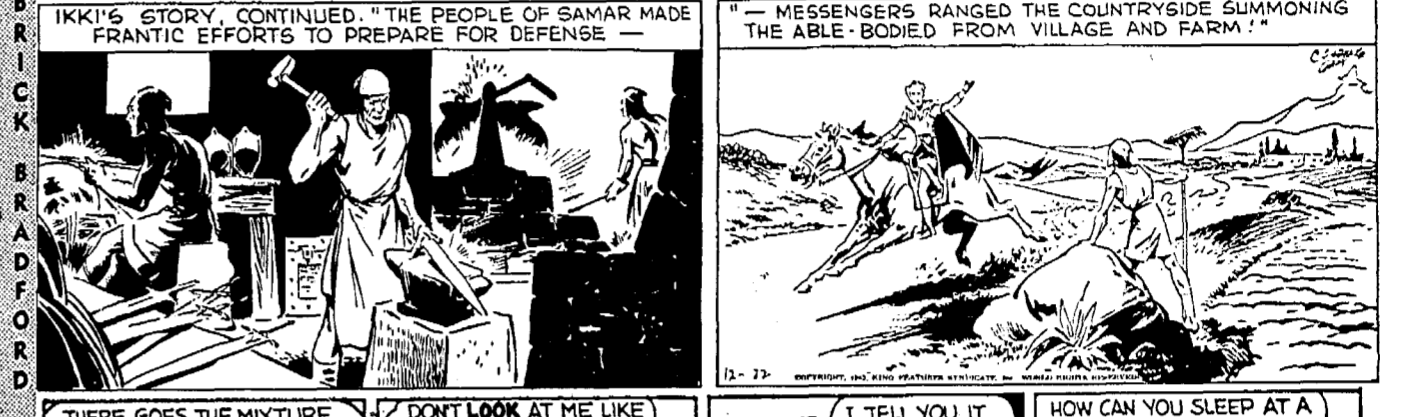
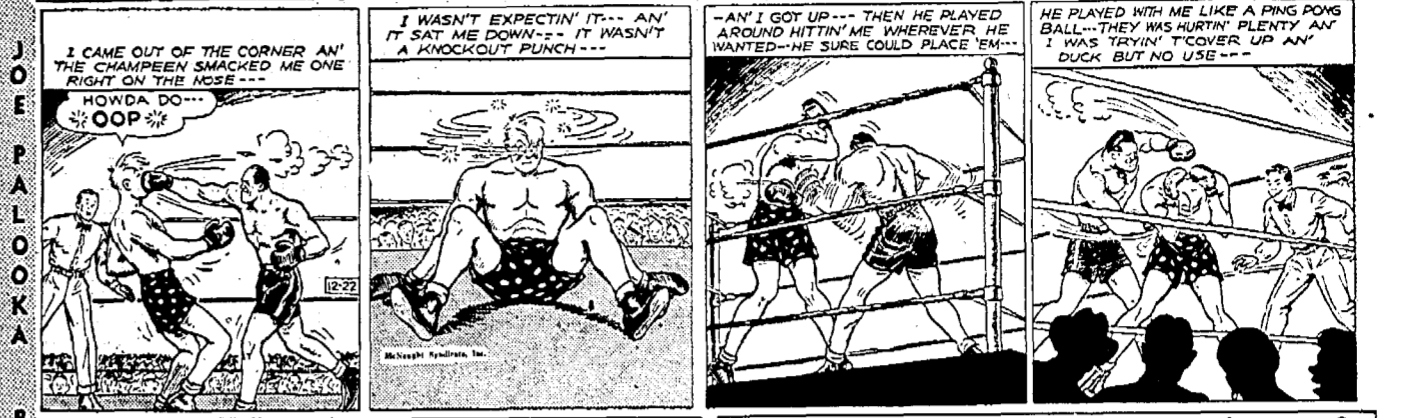

Uncle Ray's Corner
WE ARE NOW IN MIDST OF OUR SHORTEST DAYS
PEOPLE of ancient times saw the importance of sunshine, and spoke about sun gods of one kind or another. We may think about sun gods on Wednesday, Dec. 22, the shortest day of this year. The olden Greeks called their sun god Helios. They made pictures of him, and said he drove through the sky in a chariot pulled by four fiery steeds. Later this god came to be called Apollo, the name used for him by the Romans. In northern Europe it was the custom to speak of a sun god named Balder. The Norsemen had special reason to think of changes in daylight. Many of them lived where December days had only three or four hours between sunrise and sunset. Six months later, those same people enjoyed extra-long days. When I speak of short December days, I am thinking only of the northern half of the earth. The southern half is now having days which are longer than usual. People in Australia and New Zealand, for example, are having today the most daylight they will have in the entire year.
