Featuring in the cast are Gog Young, popular young leading man, John Leder and Dolores Moran. Others in the cast include Roscoe Karns and Philip Reed.

"Old Acquaintance" was directed by Vincent Sherman from the screen play by John Van Druten and Lenore Coffey.
