

Action War Drama Opens At Quilna With Prevue

Believe it or not, a tank by the name of LuluBelle is the spoiled child in the action war drama "Sahara" which comes to the screen of the Quilna theatre with the Friday prevue billing. The film stars Humphrey Bogart as the top sergeant in charge of a tankful of men who undergo several harrowing experiences in the desert campaign in North Africa. "The Gang's All Here," a technicolor musical hit, closes with the late billing Friday.

"Lassie Come Home," the story of a dog's faithfulness to his young master, comes Friday to the Ohio theatre. Showing for the last time Thursday night is "Destination Tokyo."

"Harvest Melody" and "Land Beyond the Law" are now co-featured at the Sigma where "Crazy House" and "Find the Blackmailer" are scheduled to open Saturday.

The State theatre now offers as its double-feature program, "The Good Fellows" and "The Strange Death of Adolf Hitler."

"Cattle Stampede" and "Mystery Broadcast" are the two thrillers now billed at the Lyric.

The Majestic theatre opened to play with "Behind the Rising Sun" and "Reveille With Beverly," as the co-attractions.

The compelling tale of a boy and his ever faithful dog, "Lassie Come Home," comes Friday to the Ohio theatre, adapted from the best story by Eric Knight, author of "This Above All." Filled in technicolor, amid scenic beauties representing the Scotch and English countryside, it depicts the thousand-mile journey of a gorgeous collie seeking its master.

Fred M. Wilcox directed the story of courage and loyalty. Roddy McDowall and Donald Crisp, who played father and son in "How Green Was My Valley," are re-united in the new picture, and are assisted by a cast that includes Dame May Whitty of "Mrs. Miniver" fame, Edmund Gwenn, Nigel Bruce, Elsa Lanchester, Elizabeth Taylor and Ben Webster.

"Destination Tokyo" closes Thursday night.

QUILNA

Reports coming ahead of "Sahara," the film drama of a momentous few days in the Libyan campaign, indicate that Humphrey Bogart, star of the picture, gives a performance that carries on the sensational success he achieved in "Casablanca." In this new one, which is coming to the Quilna theatre Friday prevue, Bogart plays the role of a two-fisted top sergeant, who is commander of a tank and leader of a small group of Allied fighters who struggle thru the treacherous sandy wastes of the desert, in an effort to catch up with the British Army at El Alamein.

"The Gang's All Here" closes with the prevue billing Friday night.
