Lyric Film Shows Music, Romance, Life On Coast

Music, romance, and life on the Coast all take their bows in "Hello Frisco Hello" which opened Monday at the Lyric theatre. Four great stars appear in the film which is probably the best period musical to be produced for some time. Alice Faye, John Payne, Jack Oakie, and Lynn Bari offer outstanding performances. Also appearing is "Over My Dead Body."

"Lassie Come Home" with Roddy McDowall is screened at the Ohio. Mightily film of desert war-fare is "Sahara" which is now offered at the Quilna theatre. Uproarious comedy with Olsen and Johnson providing the gags is offered by "Crazy House" now co-billed with "Find the Blackmailer" at the Sigma.

Bub Hops and Betty Hutton do the honors in "Let's Face It" which is co-featured with "Fighting Sea Monsters" at the State.

These are the days when moviegoers the nation over want pleasant diversion. They want to be entertained — carried away for a couple of hours from the work and worry of the strain we all share. With this in mind, your reviewer goes overboard for the gay new technicolor musical which opened Monday at the Lyric theatre, "Hello, Frisco, Hello."

All the elements that make up outstanding entertainment were carefully assembled in "Hello, Frisco, Hello," and the results are most pleasing to the eye and ear. Picture this: a cast topped by Alice Faye, John Payne, Jack Oakie and Lynn Bari, set to foot-tapping music, filmed in resplendent technicolor and packaged in a pleasant story—and you have some idea of the entertainment contained in "Hello, Frisco, Hello."

Co-billed is "Over My Dead Body."

Coming to the Ohio theatre Thursday, Ina Ray Hutton, enchanting beauty who conducts her sensational all-male orchestra, was born in Chicago on March 13, 1917. Her mother, Marvel Ray was a professional pianist. Ina's first stage appearance with Gus Edwards at the Palace theatre in New York four years ago. She dances in the show-stopping manner and sings hot songs with contagious feeling. She has blue eyes, saucy nose, whimsical smile and figure full of provocative curves.

Miss Hutton sang "Full of the Devil" in Lew Leslie's "Clowns in Clover" and "Never Had an Education" in George White's "Melody." The latter song, written for her by Sigmund Romberg, was the first jazz number he ever composed. Ina's greatest thrill in her young life was stopping the opening show of White's "Melody" in Philadelphia and discovering her name in big lights next day. Tommy Dorsey is her favorite orchestra leader.

Humphrey Bogart, whose sensational performance in "Casablanca" won the acclaim of motion picture fans throughout the land, comes along now with a highly worthy successor to that picture. The film is the stirring spectacular drama, "Sahara," which is playing at the Quilna theatre, and in it Bogart delivers a superb performance as a two-fisted, tough army sergeant. Certainly this portrayal will go into Hollywood records as one of the outstanding performances in the vivid screen career of this very vivid motion picture personality.
