

# Adolphe Menjou Is Guest On Amos 'n' Andy Program

Adolphe Menjou, suave screen favorite long known as Hollywood's best-dressed man, will dazzle at least two Harlem residents with his sartorial elegance when he appears as guest star on the Amos 'n' Andy broadcast to be heard Friday at 9 p. m., EST, over WEA.

## MUSIC PROGRAM TO BE FEATURE OF OPEN FORUM

An attractive program of standard orchestra compositions will be the musical feature offered by the Central high school senior orchestra in the third session of the Open Forum to be held in the school auditorium, Sunday, starting promptly at 2:30 p. m.

Included in the presentation are: "March of the Menstruators," by Richard Wagner; "Empereur Waltz," by Johann Strauss; "Hungarian Comedy Overture," by Keler Bela, and "Fifth Symphony" (Excerpt from the first movement), by Beethoven. Harold O. Clarke is director.

Following the concert, Frederic Snyder, widely traveled news analyst will edit his "verbal newspaper." Snyder trained as a newspaperman, went from a reporter's job to that of secretary of the New York state division of aliens, directing 8,500 men in supervision of aliens after the outbreak of World War I. He toured Europe on behalf of the Dawes plan of war reparation and served on a special committee of the Press Congress of the World. He also was one of six members of a board of control in the formation of the Walter Hines Page school of International Relations at John Hopkins university. The address is scheduled to begin at 2:30 p. m.

## BLAZE CAUSES MINOR DAMAGE

OTTAWA, Jan. 14 — Minor damage to the roof of the George Gilgenbach farm home was caused Thursday when sparks from the chimney ignited the roof. The Ottawa fire department went to the scene but the family and neighbors were able to extinguish the blaze a few minutes after calling the department.

Officials of the department Friday released their report on the work of the volunteer company during 1943. It shows that the total estimated loss on buildings and contents amounted to \$11,875 last year while the estimated total value of buildings and contents endangered amounted to \$73,660.

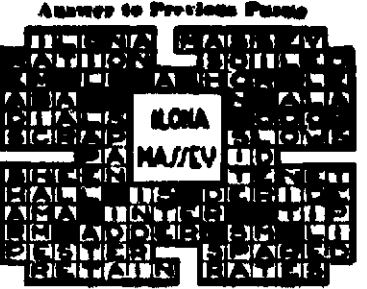

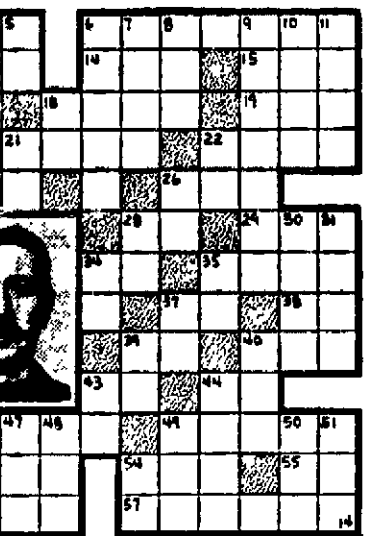
