Will West" has made very plain that fingerprints are better than the old Bertillon system in proving "who is who" among criminals.

Bertillon, a French police officer, worked out a system of photo-graphs for criminals. His system also called for the head, nose and chin to be measured. That system worked well in

many cases, and it still holds a WIBU place in the war against crime. Yet it has been known to fail. Will West, a Negro, was taken

to the prison at Leavenworth, Kansas, in 1908. The record clerk was sure he had seen him before.

The world's greatest fingerprint collection is at Washington, D. C., under charge of J. Edgar Hoover, nead of the FBI (Federal Bureau of Investigation). Millions of sets of fingerprints are on record there.

The FBI has a large force of men and women who know how to locate the proper cards. Thousands of new fingerprint records are studied each day, and help is given to police officers all over the United States. Police in Canada and other countries also receive help, and in their turn they may give help when it is asked. It has been found that criminals tend to commit the same kind of crimes over and over again.




