# Police World, **Johnson Urges**

### Giant Force Needed, Repatriate Says

The United States must cooperate after the war in "the biggest international police force ever dreamed of," William R. Johnson, China resident for 36 years, told hree Madison audiences Thurs-

day.

Johnson returned to the United States Dec. 1 on the exchange ship Gripsholm after being in-terned at Stanley prison, Hong Kong. He spoke under USO club

The Far Eastern veteran confirmed reports of Japanese atrocities, accused the British of drunkenness during the battle of Hong Kong, and said the people of the United States should have recognized that war with Japan was inevitable when the Japs invaded Manchuria in 1931.

"We Americans pride ourselves on our intelligence, our free press, and our basic civil liberties," he declared, "but why didn't we know our own war when we saw it? Had we prepared for this war to this size."




