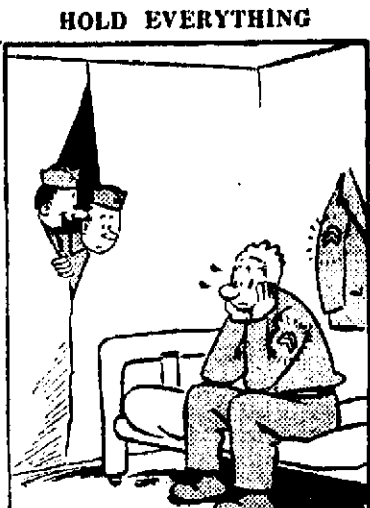

DEATH IN ITALY IS REPORTED

(Special To The Lima News) NEW BREMEN, Jan. 18—Mr. and Mrs. J. O. Cross received news here of the death of Pvt. Edgar Cross in Italy, from the soldier's wife, who was notified by the War department at Ashland, O., where she has lived with her eight-months-old child since her husband entered the service. Cause of the death of Pvt. Cross, who had served overseas six months with the Fifth Army, was not disclosed.

First Sgt. Carl Schroerlucke, who served overseas nearly two years, now is in a military hospital in Springfield, Mo., according to news received by William Schroerlucke of New Bremen and the soldier's wife at New Knoxville. The message did not state the nature of his illness.

BLUFFTON BANK IS REORGANIZED

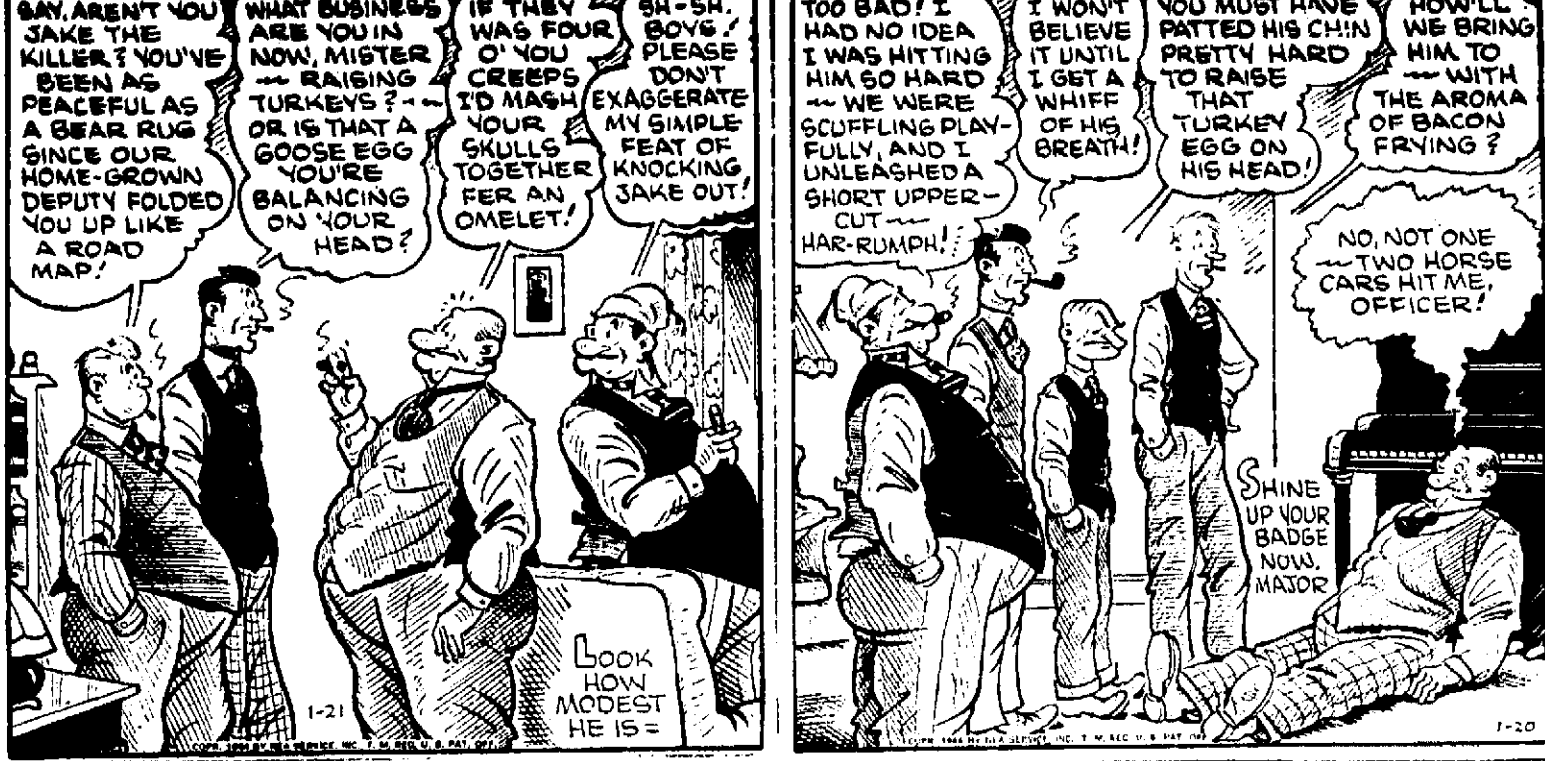

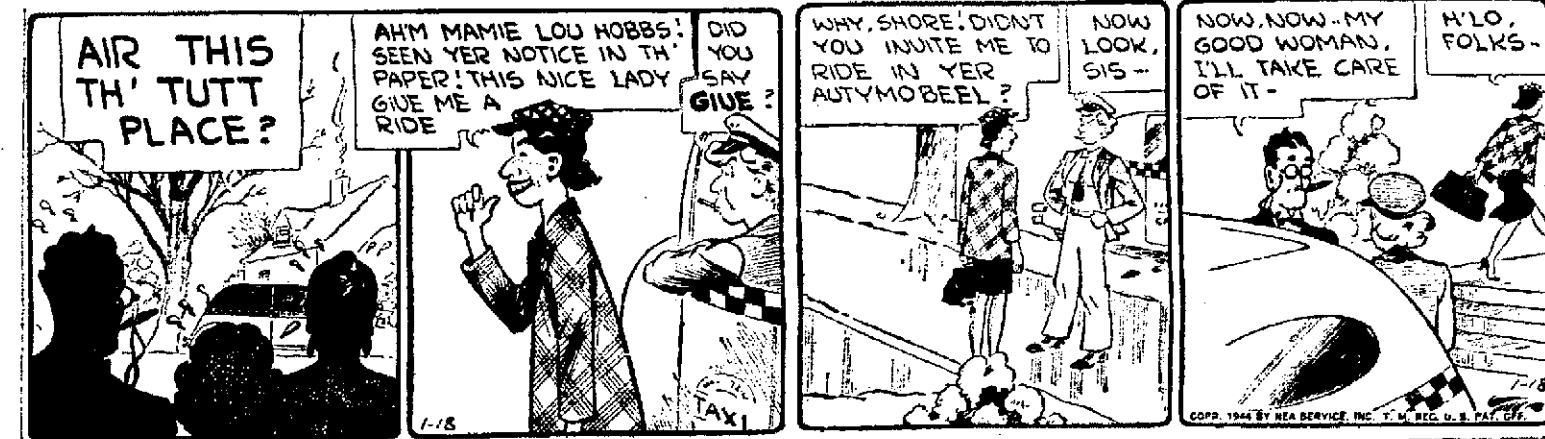

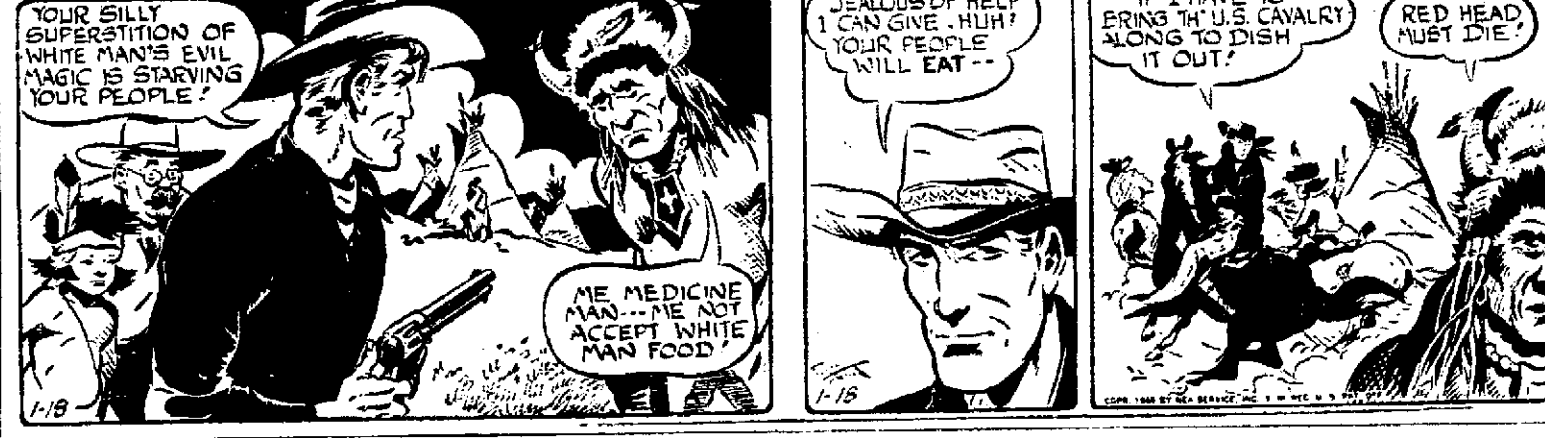

LYRIC A story based on the shrewd and oft-times brilliant designs of the adventurous men and women who form the mysterious espionage circles in Europe has been made into a film that is, according to reports, one of the most arresting spy melodramas to come out of Hollywood in a long time.

George Sanders, British actor, is co-starring with Marguerite Chapman, young Columbia player who is rapidly climbing to the top of the screen favorite list. Sanders plays the role of an R. A. F. commander who, purposely falls into disgrace in his own country, in order that he may ingratiate himself with a powerful Nazi group.

How well he does it is shown by the fact that they permit him to become a feature on a Berlin radio network, where he manages to send coded messages thru to British Intelligence, even while he seemingly reviles his own country.

Marguerite Chapman's role is an unusual one, in that she is a beautiful German girl who must win the sympathy of her audience. Her refusal of the Nazi party, her love for the British agent, and the discovery that the latter has outwitted the Germans, lead to a highly dramatic finish.

QUILNA "It Happened One Night," co-starring Clark Gable and Claudette Colbert, is now at the Quilna theatre.

This delightfully modern romance which has its locale in buses, auto-camps, ramshackle automobiles, and a Fifth-av mansion, was directed by Frank Capra from a screen story by Robert Riskin. It is based on the Samuel Hopkins Adams novelette which

ran in the Cosmopolitan magazine. Walter Connolly, Jameson Thomas, and Roscoe Karns enact the supporting roles. Connolly is cast as Miss Colbert's father, Thomas as her husband, and Karns as a wise-cracking salesman.

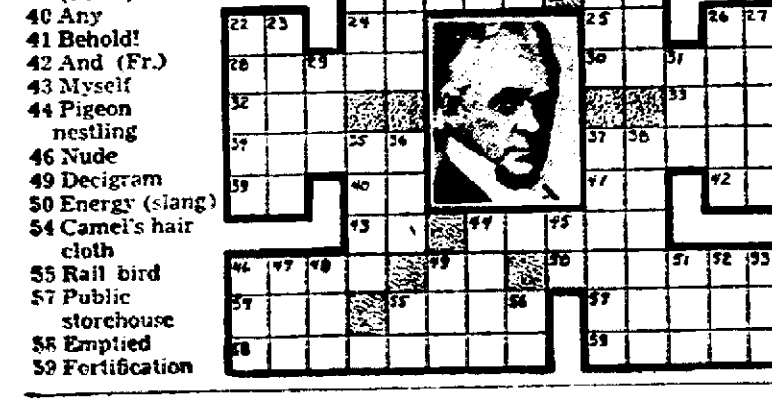
