Animals, Plants and Chemistry Supply Bristles for Brushes

WHEN WE speak of brushes, we are likely to think of hairbrushes, but there are many other kinds. Among them are clothes brushes, painters' brushes, art brushes, scrubbing brushes, shaving brushes, and toothbrushes.


