HAITIAN STUDENT SEES FATHER IN NEWSREEL

SAN LUIS OBISPO, Cal., Dec. 30.—(UP)—Max Lescot hadn't seen his family in more than a year and a half until the night he went to a theatre with some fellow students from California Polytechnic college.

That night he saw his father shaking hands with President Roosevelt—in a newsreel.

His father is Elie Lescot, president of the Republic of Haiti, and the occasion was the meeting where he pledged Haiti's cooperation in the United Nations' war effort.

Max Lescot, who was born in Port-de-Paix, Haiti, April 20, 1921, is the fourth of seven children of Haiti's executive. He has four brothers and two sisters.

His eldest brother, Gerard, is secretary of state in Haiti; the next oldest, Roger, is a lieutenant in the Haitian army and is chief of the president's personal staff. Another brother, Henry, studied at Cornell university and is now a commercial producer of oil from lemon grass and citrus in Haiti.

Lescot is majoring in crops production and working toward his bachelor of science degree in agriculture. He attended Port-au-Prince schools until 1937 when his father was appointed Haitian ambassador to the United States and the family moved to Washington. He was graduated from Dunbar high school there in 1940. His father served as ambassador until 1941 when he was elected president.

BRITISH TOT OWES LIFE TO AMERICAN NAVY

LONDON, Dec. 30.—(INS)—Lesley Cotton, aged 2 1/2, of London, Eng., has the American Navy to thank for saving her life.

A few weeks ago she was taken to a North London hospital dangerously ill. As she grew worse the doctors decided that only one thing could save her life, that one thing was—orange juice.

The search for oranges began. Oranges are so scarce here, that very few adults have seen one in all four years of war.

For three days the hospital staff tried grocers' stores, hospitals, the British and American Red Cross and the Ministry of Health; but no oranges were forthcoming.

Then someone suggested the American Embassy, who put them on a U. S. Naval Unit, and, in the words of a hospital official, "They turned up triumphs."

When the Navy heard of the child's plight, they supplied, within 24 hours, sufficient oranges to save her life.
