

Largest of all the world's clams are the "giant clams" in certain warm parts of the Pacific and Indian oceans. Their main homes are coral reefs around the East Indies.

Giant clams have been found with a weight of well over 500 pounds! Most of this weight is in the two parts of the heavy shell. The body itself seldom weighs more than 20 pounds, but it has powerful muscles which can pull the shells together. More than one unhappy pearl diver has been caught by the snapping shells of a giant clam, and has been drowned


