ALERTNESS IS EMPHASIZED IN SAFETY POSTER

Importance of looking all ways at intersections before crossing the street, being especially alert for turning cars, is emphasized in the AAA-OSAA school safety poster for February being distributed to school by the Lima Automobile Club.

The traffic fatalities dropped last year from a total of 28,200 in 1942 to approximately 24,000 in 1943, pedestrian fatalities did not drop in proportion, according to Mrs. Minnie Walsh, secretary of the club.

"Last year, pedestrian fatalities were nearly one-half of the traffic fatalities in the country," she said. "For several years before the war started, pedestrian fatalities constituted about two-fifths of all fatalities, but the greater amount of walking, especially at night, and unfamiliarity of both children and adults with new surroundings caused by war plant employment, has raised the ratio of pedestrian to non-pedestrian fatalities.

"The new poster is one of the AAA-OSAA 'We Work for Victory, Too' series of posters presented this year by the club as part of its civic safety program. Each poster pictures children making their own contribution to the war effort, at the same time practicing a safe walking rule. Thousands of children, as depicted in the poster, have been engaged in the collection of scrap, waste paper, etc."

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HANDBOOK FOR SCHOOLS GIVES JOB GUIDANCE

PITTSBURGH, Feb. 10.—(UP)—Catholic educators are not only stressing the moral and intellectual development of pupils, but also are providing vocational guidance to prepare students for lifetime jobs.

A handbook published by the diocese of Pittsburgh under the supervision of the Rev. Thomas J. Quigley, superintendent of schools, reiterates that work is dignified and that manual labor is not to be looked down on.

The program as outlined in the guidebook includes speakers on vocational topics, occupational surveys and suggestions on how to get and hold a job.

Regarding the aims of education, the handbook advocates teachers instill in their pupils the moral virtues of justice, temperance and fortitude. Guidance counselors are also advised to offer aid in health matters, and emotional maladjustments and worries.

School work should never be given as a punishment, the book advised, as it creates a feeling of hatred among pupils toward their studies. It also discouraged undesirable form of punishment, such as sarcasm and ridicule, personal indignities such as striking and shaking, and memorizing class assignments.

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OREGON FARMERS SET NEW PRODUCTION GOALS

CORVALLIS, Ore., Feb. 10.—(INS)—Emphasis on production practices that will help Oregon farmers replace "manpower with landpower" features the 1944 AAA program recommendations of the former committee who administer the state's program.

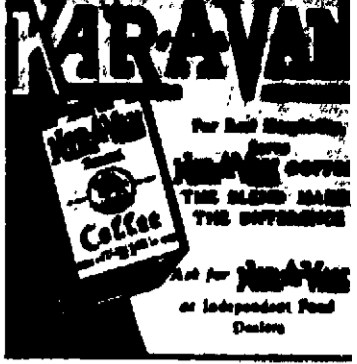
The state committee's recommendations, based on views of county committeemen and prepared with the assistance of a

technical group of Oregon State college specialists, would encourage wider use of practices that will increase or maintain the per-acre war food production strength of Oregon farmland.

Special emphasis is asked for a group of practices that will increase production of forage crops needed to feed the state's record number of livestock. These practices include seeding legumes and permanent pasture mixtures, construction of drainage and diversion ditches, pasture improvement and renovation, control of poisonous

and destructive plants and harvesting seed of forage crops. The committee requested continuation of a second group of practices that would assist in maintaining production at present high levels.
