When a person "sheds crocodile tears," he makes believe that he is sad. Because we hear about such tears now and then, we may wonder whether crocodiles really weep. The answer is "No." The crocodile sheds a bit of water when it lifts its head above the surface, but it doesn't send out tears.

The idea of crocodile tears seems to have come from two stories which were told in early days. One of these said that the animal wept after swallowing a victim. The other declared that the noise of crying was made to get someone to come close enough to supply a meal.

Even without those stories, crocodiles are interesting — and dangerous — animals. For the most part they eat fish, but many of them are quite willing to eat a human being who may happen along.

Africa has quite a number of what we may call "middle-sized" crocodiles. They often have a length of 12 to 15 feet. Time and again they have been known to eat natives who have waded in the water.

The Nile river has many of these crocodiles, but for the most part they are in the upper branches. Thanks to large-bore rifles they have been almost wiped out in the part of the Nile which flows through Egypt.

In ancient times the Egyptians had no guns, and most of them were smart enough not to go swimming in the Nile. They did, however, follow a silly custom. They came to look upon the crocodile as a "holy" animal.

The world's largest crocodiles are found off the southeastern coast of Asia and near Australia. They are known as "salt water crocodiles" and are the only members of the family which swim in the ocean.
