Catholic Charities Drive Opens Mar. 19

The 1944 Catholic charities campaign in 17 counties will open Mar. 19 and continue until Apr. 2, it was announced today by Archbishop Moses E. Kiley. A quota of \$250,000 has been set for the campaign in order that 32 institutions and agencies may be assisted to continue their work of charity. Every parish in the archdiocese will conduct a solicitation of funds during the two weeks period. "Funds will be used for the maintenance of our charitable institutions and relief in the homes," the archbishop said. "Almost every phase of human misfortune is relieved through the institutions and charitable organizations supported by the alms of the people."

Uncle Ray's Corner

GIANT SQUIDS HAVE ARMS MANY FEET LONG

SQUIDS SWIM BACKWARDS

Think of an animal with arms which grow right out of its head! Such an animal is the squid. It has 10 arms and they stretch out from points around the mouth. Two of the squid's arms are much longer than the others. They are used to seize prey, and have disks at the ends to hold things tight. The other eight arms are used to push food into the mouth after it is brought in by the long arms. Squids differ greatly in size. Some kinds are less than three feet long. Others are of enormous size. Known as "giant squids," they rank as the largest animals without backbones. One giant squid was captured off the coast of Nova Scotia. When it was measured, it was found to have a body 20 feet long, and its longest arms measured 35 feet. Altogether, it was 55 feet long! The barrel-like body of that squid was about six feet thick. Its eyes were close to eight inches wide. Many years ago the "Montreal Gazette" published a letter about fluid which darkened the water for 200 or 300 yards. "The men brought the arms ashore. Mr. Murray, of the geological survey, and I examined one of the arms carefully, and had it photographed. It was 19 feet long." (For NATURE section of your scrapbook.)
