GIANT SQIDS HAVE ARMS MANY FEET LONG

Think of an animal with arms which grow right out of its head! Such an animal is the squid. It has 10 arms and they stretch out from points around the mouth. Two of the squid's arms are


much longer than the others. They are used to seize prey, and have disks at the ends to hold things tight. The other eight arms are used to push food into the mouth after it is brought in by the long arms.

Squids are ocean animals. They have no backbones, but each one has a heart, a brain and a pair of

Some kinds are less than three feet long. Others are of enormous form, is the letter size. Known as "giant souids." they rank as the largest animals without backbones.

Squids differ greatly in size.






