## Uncle Ray's Corner

THE OLDEN Norsemen used to speak about a god of winter called "Ulf." He was said to move from one mountain to another with great speed, and on his feet he wore skis.

It was quite natural for the Norsemen to put skis on their god of winter. They, themselves, had been using skis to cross snow for time untold. Without long, narrow "shoes" of this kind, they would have had great trouble in going from one place to another.

It may be that Norsemen wore skis before they learned to make ocean-going boats. Eleven hundred years ago, one of their poets spoke of such boats as "skis of the sea."

The first record of a regular ski contest goes back less than a century. In about the year 1860 there was a gathering in the Telemark district of Norway, and ski contests were held. The contest idea soon spread to Sweden and Denmark. Later it was adopted in Switzerland, Canada, the United States and some other countries.

In Norway, before the present war, it was a custom to hold "the Norwegian Derby" each year. Among the events were cross-country races. In one of these a record of 15 and a half miles in two hours and seven minutes was made on skis. This was a speed of very close to seven and a half miles an hour.

Another cross-country record was made by a Lapp who traveled 138 miles in 21 hours and 22 minutes. His average was almost six and a half miles an hour, which was very good for such a distance.
