

"Cross Of Lorraine" Opens Wednesday On Sigma Screen

The story of a group of French soldiers imprisoned by the Nazis as hostages after the fall of France is graphically told in the forthcoming Sigma film, "Cross of Lorraine," which starts Wednesday with "Career Girl." Showing for the final times Tuesday are "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" and "Timber Queen."

Joan Davis and Jinx Falkenburg are the featured performers of the laugh-loaded Lyric film, "Two Senoritas From Chicago." Of more serious nature, but no less entertaining, is the co-feature, "Submarine Base."

Ohio theatre fans are treated to an intellectual romance as the love story of two great scientists is unfolded in "Madame Curie." Greer Garson and Walter Pidgeon portray the leading roles.

When parents are away from home leaving children without restrictions on their behavior, such things happen as are revealed in "Where Are Your Children?" the current Quilna attraction. Shown also is "Mr. Muggs Steps Out."

Bette Davis, leading female dramatic actress of the day, has the starring role of "Old Acquaintance," now at the State theatre. "Adventures of a Rookie" completes the double billing.

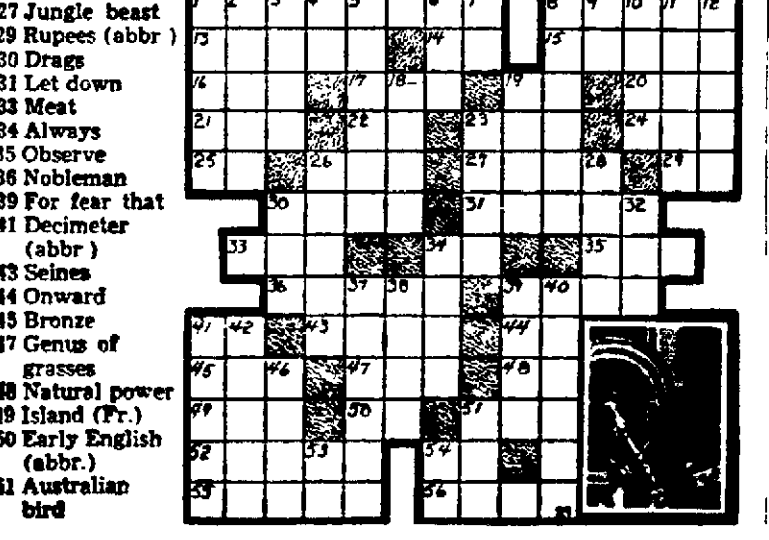
PRISON INMATE IS SLAIN IN ARGUMENT
