

# New Olsen-Johnson Film Opens At State Thursday

Topping the hilarity of "Hellsapoppin" is the new Olsen and Johnson film "Crazy House" which opens at the State theatre Thursday. The story deals with the difficulties of selling yourself and your story to a director and the two great comedians are guaranteed to have you rolling in the aisles from start to finish. Sordid details of the operation of so-called "juke joints," and the part that these deadfalls play in the demoralization of the youth of the country, are exposed in "Where Are Your Children?" dramatic story of child delinquency now screened at the Quilna theatre along with "Mr. Muggs Steps Out."

Reports coming in ahead of "Destroyer," the picture, which will be presented at the Lyric theatre on Thursday, indicate that it is a vivid screen story of a group of average fighting Americans aboard a ship they help build and which they grow to love. 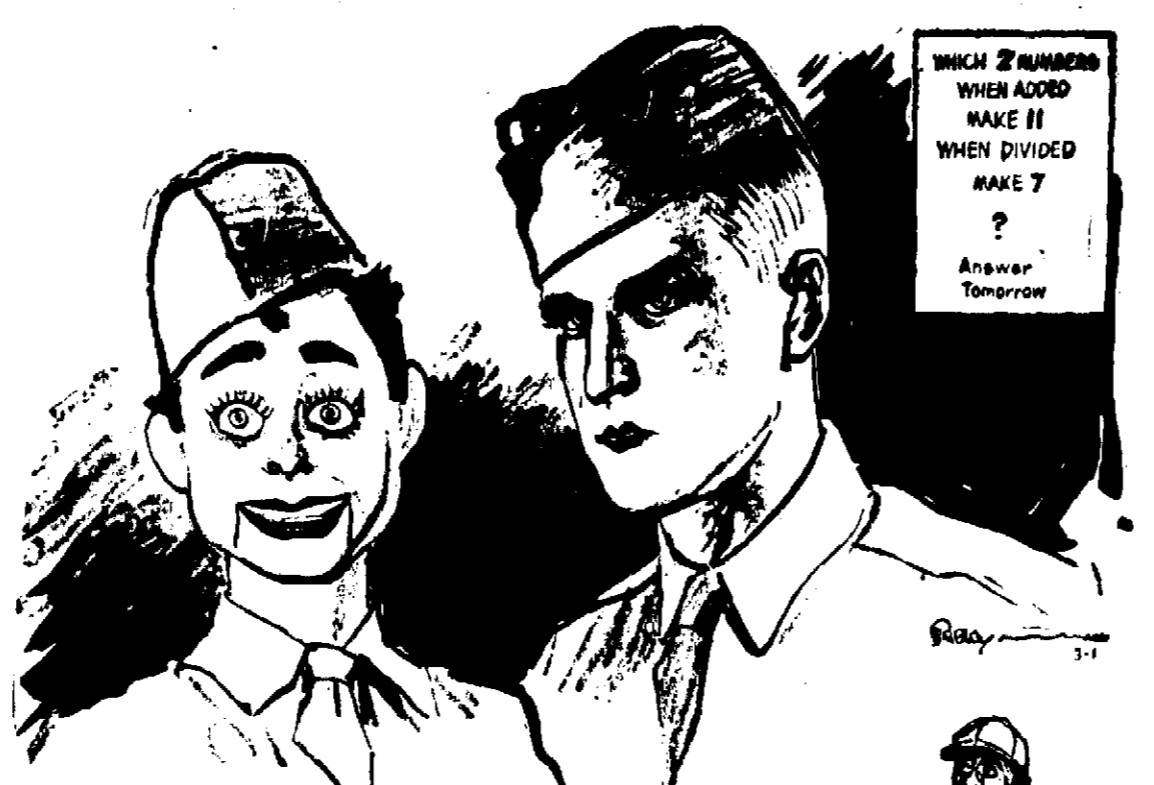

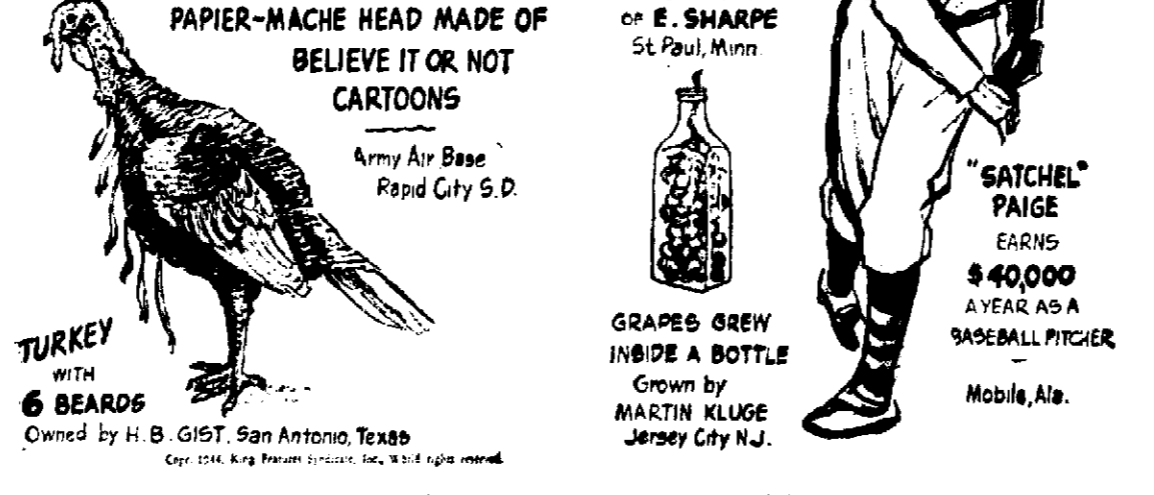

## COMPROMISE ON BALLOTS ADOPTED

WASHINGTON, March 1.—(AP)—Senate and house conferees have finally agreed on a compromise service vote plan but they have left it up to the states to take it or leave it.

The plan would grant federal ballots for the armed forces only if the states agree to their use. Generally it provides for a federally distributed ballot to be used by voters of states which have their own absentee ballot machinery if the governors certify its acceptability before Aug. 1.

In states which have no absentee voting law it can be used only if the governors certify it will be welcomed as a bonafide vote.
