AUTHOR VICTOR IN PLAGIARISM

ST. LOUIS, March 4—(AP)—Federal Judge George H. Moore, in a finding of plagiarism against Twentieth Century-Fox Film Corp., ruled today the movie, "Alexander's Ragtime Band" was based on an unpublished novel written by Mrs. Marie Cooper Oehler Dieckhaus, now living in Casper, Wyo.

The judge said Mrs. Dieckhaus was entitled to damages for use of the book, "Love Girl," the amount to be fixed by a special commissioner. Her attorney, who said the movie "grossed in excess of \$5,000,000," said he expected the decision would be appealed by the film company.
