## FLIER DIES IN CRASH

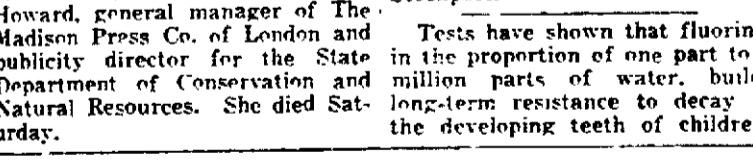
