NEW SERIES OF TALKS PLANNED BY LECTURER

Dr. Jay M. Hoffman, Bible and Health lecturer announced Thursday the opening of a new series of lectures at the Bible Tabernacle, Spring and Pierce sts.

DRIVE STARTS FOR MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

City-wide collection of musical instruments for the soldiers at the front begins in Lima Thursday.

Part of a nation-wide campaign to provide our fighting men with the means of making their own music, the drive is directed at rounding up the hundreds of saxophones, banjos, and other instruments that lie forgotten in closets and attics throughout the city.

The Army has requested "Coca-Cola" bottlers all over the country to act as agents for this campaign. Anybody having any unused musical instruments may take them to any grocery store, filling station, drug store or other place that sells bottled Coca-Cola, or to the local bottling plant at S. West-st at North Shore-dr. The trucks of the Lima Coca-Cola Bottling Co. have agreed to pick the instruments up at these places and ship them off to the Army which in turn will distribute them to the soldiers.

Any instruments except pianos, bull fiddles, or phonographs are urgently needed, according to C. C. Paul, manager of the local Coca-Cola Bottling Co.

MEALS LIMITED BY LAW
 A rationing system that prohibited anyone in the realm, regardless of what estate or condition, from serving more than two courses at any meal, was imposed by Henry VIII of England, who permitted the serving of three courses on feast days as an exception.
