WAPAK COUNCIL TO TALK "TIME"

Adoption Of Fast Or Slow Schedule Discussed

(Lima News Bureau) WAPAKONETA, March 22.—The dilemma of "fast or slow" time in Wapakoneta during the summer months will be solved city officials said today after the neighboring cities had made their decision.

Wapakoneta citizens set their clocks ahead last spring after numerous requests from workers going to defense plants in Lima, St. Marys and Sidney.

Melvin Kah, president of city council, stated today that requests had been received by a group of farmers from near Moulton to remain on "slow" time.

Clerks and personnel in local stores and the courthouse were divided in their opinions. Some pointed out that the extra hour permitted more daylight time for gardening while others preferred to let the time remain the same and avoid the confusion in the change at spring and fall.

Mayor Wilbur Fleming said the matter would probably be discussed at the next council meeting, April 5, and consideration would be given workers' requests for the same time as neighboring cities.

LIMA RENT CASE IS SETTLED BY JUDGE KLOEB

Permanent position from demanding more than the maximum legal rent of evicting tenants in violation of the rent regulations has been decreed by Federal Judge Frank C. Kloeb of Toledo in a Lima case.

Judge Kloeb signed the permanent injunction on a consent decree, it was revealed by John O. Munn, district information executive of the OPA in Toledo, against William C. Zeller and C. Franklin Jervis, both of 934 W. Market-st., Lima. There was no trial.

The entry provides that the defendants be enjoined permanently from demanding or receiving more than the maximum legal rent or evicting any tenants in violation of the maximum rent regulation.

The case was filed in federal court in the name of Chester Bowles, OPA administrator, against Zeller and Jervis, on information furnished the Lima OPA Rent office by J. A. Krabach. He charged in the information that the defendants sought to have him sign a year's lease for a dwelling unit in which he then resided, at \$155 a month. At the time he was paying \$100 a month, he told rent control officials.

The suit was filed by the enforcement division of the OPA in the Toledo district.

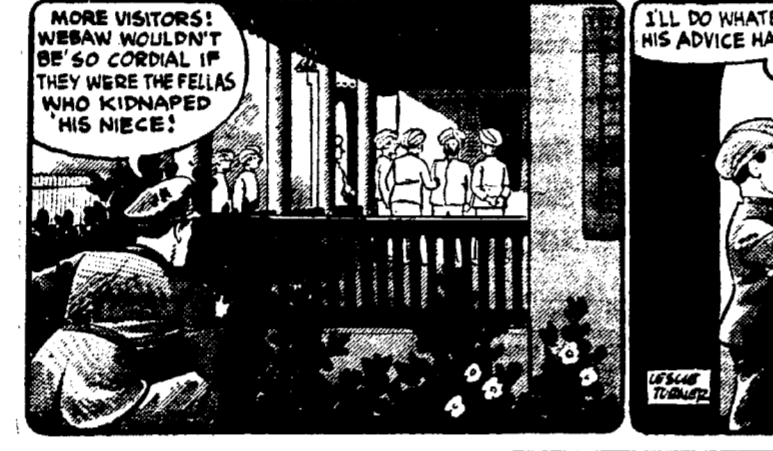

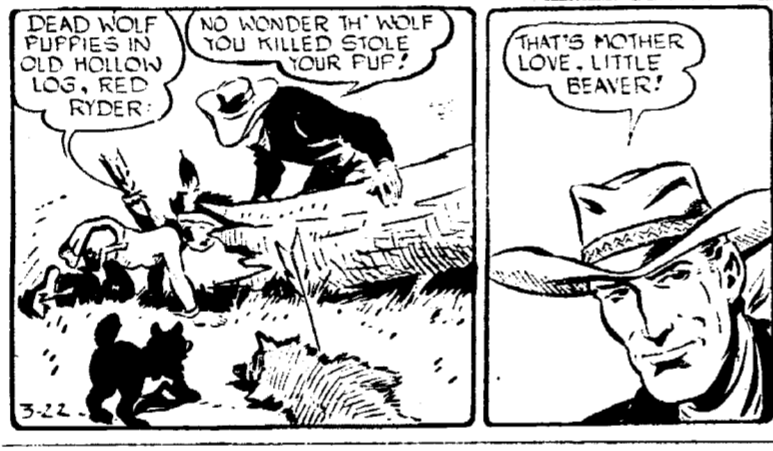

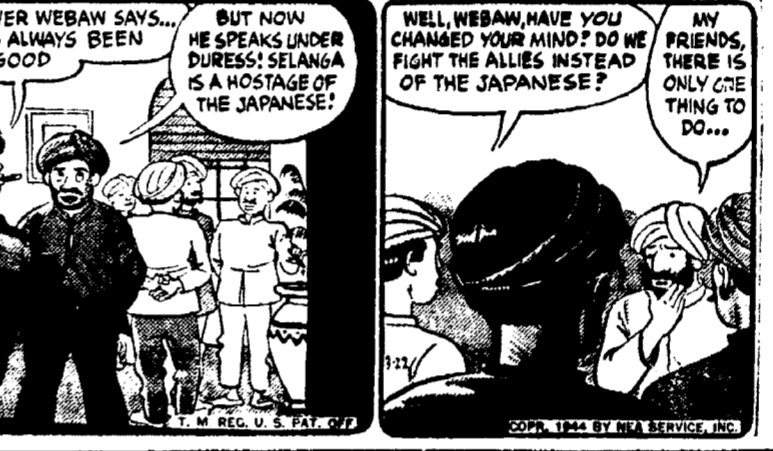

FARM LABOR SURVEY PLANNED IN PUTNAM-CO

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, March 22.—Designed to determine how much extra farm labor will be needed in Putnam-co this summer, a survey is being conducted by the neighborhood labor-machine committee chairman.

The survey is planned to show how many full time and part time workers will be needed in addition to the present supply of workers in this county. The survey will be used as a guide for the county labor committee in securing outside labor for Putnam-co.

If outside labor is needed, as agriculture leaders feel certain it is, arrangements must be made soon to obtain these workers. For this reason, the men making the survey are urging their fellow-farmers to study their needs and be ready to report when they are asked about labor.

BEER ALCOHOLIC CONTENT CUT TO 3.3 PER CENT

NEW YORK, March 22.—(INS)—The nation's beer drinkers were informed officially today that the alcoholic strength of their favorite beverage has been reduced almost to the point of pre-repeal vintage. The brewing industry announced that civilian beer now has an alcoholic content of 3.3 per cent, or one-tenth of one per cent more than the old 3.2 which was the standard from April 7 to Dec. 5, 1933, when prohibition was repealed.

A year ago, the industry said, most beers ranged around five per cent, with a few running slightly over six per cent.

Cause of it all is the industry's attempt to stretch raw materials far enough to meet increased demand. Production is up 13 per cent over last year, but the demand is up 300 per cent, the industry disclosed.

MINSTER, March 22.—S. Sgt. Paul J. Bertsch, 28, Anna, the son of Mrs. Margaret Bertsch, has been missing in action since March 3 according to a War department telegram received by his mother. Tail turret gunner on a Liberator bomber based in England, Sgt. Bertsch, in recent letters mentioned heavy raids and told of one experience in which his bomber limped back to base battered and crippled, with one motor out.
