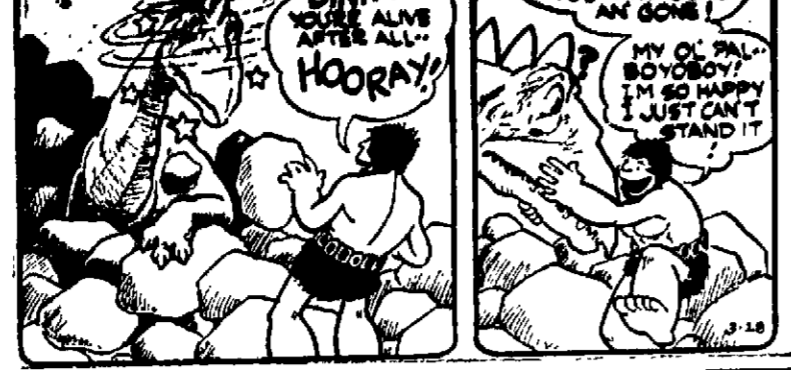

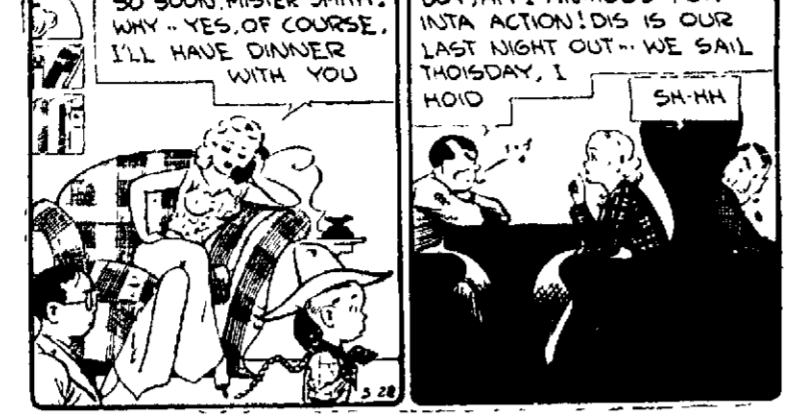

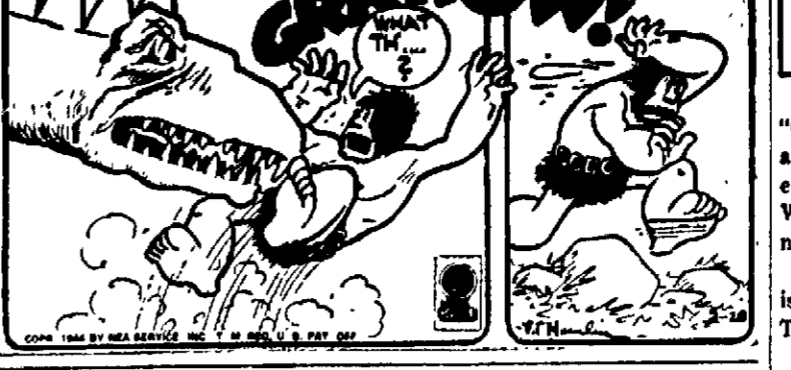
CONTINENTAL YOUTH KILLED

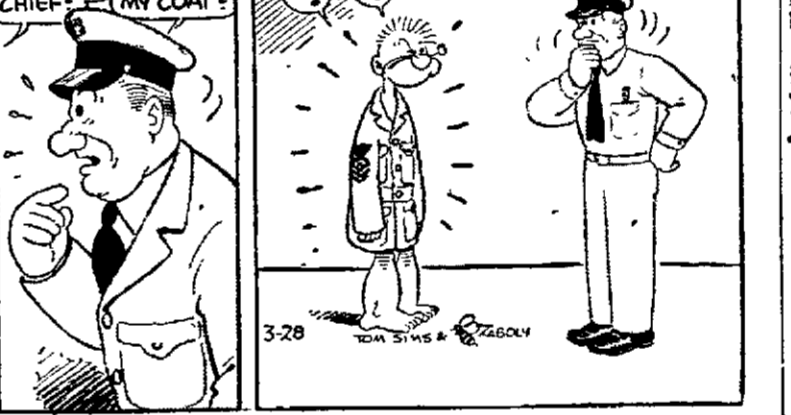

"Curse Of The Cat People" Offered Film Fans At Sigma

With the aid of this ring and a photograph of Irena, her father's first wife, the child brings the dead woman back to life.

Resenting punishment, the child runs away in a blizzard, seeks refuge in the old woman's home and there faces sudden death, being saved at the crucial moment by the intervention of Irena.
