MELVIN HARMON NAMED SCHOOL HEAD AT GILBOA (Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, April 6—Resignation of C. L. Bard as superintendent of the Blanchard schools at Gilboa-tp and appointment of Melvin Harmon to succeed him were announced here today by the Blanchard board of education.

Bard resigned after serving as head of the Blanchard system nine years. He left to become field representative for the United States Employment Service out of the Lima office.

Harmon assumes his duties at once, the board announced. He is a native of Blanchard-tp, a graduate of the former Crawfis high school near Gilboa and Bowling Green State university. Harmon has taught in the Blanchard schools for the last 18 years, serving as principal for the last few years.

Mrs. Lois Hickerson has been advanced to the post of principal to replace Harmon. She is completing her ninth year in the Gilboa system. She is a graduate of Ohio Northern university and a native of Lafayette in Allen-co.

It was during Bard's tenure of office at Gilboa that the community supported the construction of a new building in the village and the school facilities were moved from the old Crawfis college campus east of here into Gilboa.

Home Front Forecast

By ANN STEVICK With the Wool Products Labeling Act in force since July 14, 1941, you are no longer on your own as to the actual content of wool cloth. A manufacturer must label all fabrics that contain wool with the kind (new, reprocessed or reused) and amount of wool fiber used.

Department of Agriculture textile specialists can help you analyze the label: Reprocessed wool is reclaimed from woven or felted wool products that have never been used. Reused wool is made from worn and discarded fabrics. These old materials are disinfected and cleaned before reuse; hence there is no danger from a sanitary point of view in using this type of wool.

New, or virgin wool, has more resiliency and strengthens than the same wool when reclaimed. A serviceable product can be made with some reprocessor or reused fiber, and its use makes the cost of wool more reasonable. Good wool fabrics feel soft and springy. Poor-quality materials feel harsh and lack elasticity.

Wool is napped by a process that pulls some fibers loose. Heavy napping makes a soft, thick, attractive cloth. It may be found, or it may conceal defects in the basic yarn. Some wools which appear to have a deep nap have had waste fiber called flecks worked into the cloth. These will come out because they are not twisted into the yarn.

Experts say you can peer at the wrong side of such fabrics to see whether basic yarns are firm and strong. To determine whether an apparently heavy nap is due to flecks, rub the cloth briskly. If excessive lint rolls up, part of the nap is probably loose fibers. The material will be threadbare in a short time.

Test Workmanship In buying wool garments such as tailored jackets, clothing experts point out that there are important factors besides the fabric. An elementary test of high-grade cut and workmanship can be made by checking careful matching of fabric patterns such as checks, plaids, or stripes. This will indicate whether the cutting was done on one or few garments, or by machine cutting thru many layers of cloth.
