Spider Crabs Are Largest Members of the Family

Some crabs are able to make noises of one kind or another. Among these are the so-called "ghost crabs," which are noted for their ability to move fast. They live in colonies on sandy beaches, and their homes are hollows in the sand.

Those swift-footed crabs are able to produce noise by rubbing their claws over rough parts of their shells. The claw is rubbed over a part which would be like the edge of the chest—if a crab had a chest! The noises seem to be made, in part at least, to warn other crabs to stay out of homes which are in use.

Some of the shelled animals known as mussels have visitors inside their shells. These visitors are the little pea crabs.

The body of a pea crab is less than an inch wide, and the tiny animal would hardly be safe out in the great world. So it seeks out a shellfish—sometimes a cockle instead of a mussel—and gets under cover.

People of ancient times knew about the pea crab and its habits. They said that its host gave
