Captain Charles Boycott lived in Ireland in the second half of the past century. He was an agent who collected rents from tenants on a large estate, and fell into trouble with them over the amount of the rents. To punish him, the tenants tore down the fences on his property and stole his letters. Even his servants turned against him, and would work for him no longer.

Since that time, only 60 years ago, the word "boycott" has been used a great deal. When people become angry with some company, they may "boycott" it by refusing to buy the things it makes. There are, however, laws against certain kinds of boycotts.

Charles Lynch, a Virginia planter, is believed to have been the original "Lynch" who gave his name to "Lynch's law," and later 'lynch law." It appears that he 'took the law into his own hands' more than a century and a half ago. I can find no record, howver, that he committed murder. Today when a person is "lynched," t means that he is murdered by a mob. Commonly the victim is acused of a crime, but he is not allowed to appear in court to de-
