



the eastern side of England, from the county known as Suffolk up to Scotland. At first they lived chiefly on the coast of the North sea, but they later spread inland, forming the powerful kingdom of Mercia in central England. It is from the Angles that the name of England came. "England"

grew out of "Angla-land" or "Engla-land." The Saxons also had an early

home in the Schleswig area, and were closely related to the Angles. The Saxons, however, spread far and wide over what is now called Germany. For a time they held power over great stretches of land between the Elbe and Rhine rivers. A part of Germany today bears the name of Saxony. Many Saxons invaded the south-

ern half of England. There is an English county now known as Essex, meaning "land of the East Saxons." There also are the counties of Middlesex (Middle Saxons) and "Sussex" (South Saxons). Less is known about the Jutes, and people spoke of England's but they are supposed to have "Anglo-Saxons." In years which
