


















Uncle Ray's Corner

FELT HATS WERE COMMON IN! he said to me one day: ANCIENT DAYS

In my travels, the best guide I ever have found is Marcus Antonious, an Egyptian. Only the other day I had a letter from him, sent from Cairo, and it shows that be still remembers my visit in 1937. For my part, I shall not forget the fine work he did in guiding me from one pyramid to another, and through underground tombs. Among the things I remember

about Marcus Antonious is the red cap or fez which he wore. This was the common headgear for guides and many other men in Egypt, but
