As Body Builder he was the only male inside the gates, since all others—social callers and studio executives alike—could step no further than the Cover Girl House front portal.

LAUSCHE SEES NEED FOR NEW INDUSTRIES

CANTON, O., April 18—(AP)—Mayor Frank J. Lausche of Cleveland, Democratic gubernatorial candidate, believes Ohio may have to set up a new governmental department to induce industrial expansion within the state.

Commenting on future expansion of industry, Lausche last night told a joint committee meeting of the State Democratic club and Women's Democratic club, "It may be that if we are to keep pace, Ohio, will have to set up a separate department, the principal function of which shall be to induce the expansion of industries that are already here, and to attract new industries to our boundaries."

Frazier Reams of Toledo and James W. Huffman of Columbus, two other candidates for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination, urged that President Roosevelt be returned to the White House for a fourth term.

Huffman advocated use of the state treasury surplus for veteran benefit and Reams attacked departments of the present state administration.

Lausche urged Ohio legislators to "cast aside all political considerations" in adopting legal provisions that will permit a maximum number of the state's servicemen and women to vote.

CAPITAL OFFICE FOR BRICKER DISCUSSED

WASHINGTON, April 18—(AP)—Advisability of opening a campaign headquarters in Washington for Gov. John W. Bricker of Ohio, candidate for the Republican nomination for president, was discussed here, yesterday by Don Ebright, Ohio's state treasurer, and members of congress from that state.

Ebright conferred with the congressmen at the request of Roy Moore, Canton publisher and campaign manager for Bricker. Rep. Walter E. Brehm of Logan said members of the governor's campaign organization were anxious to open an office here.

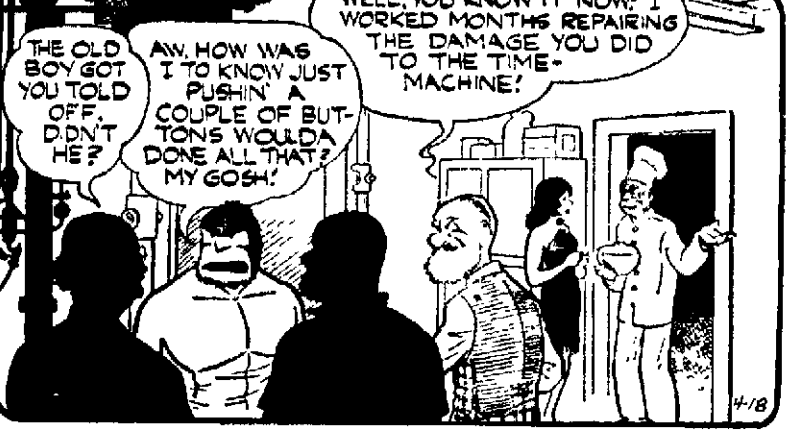

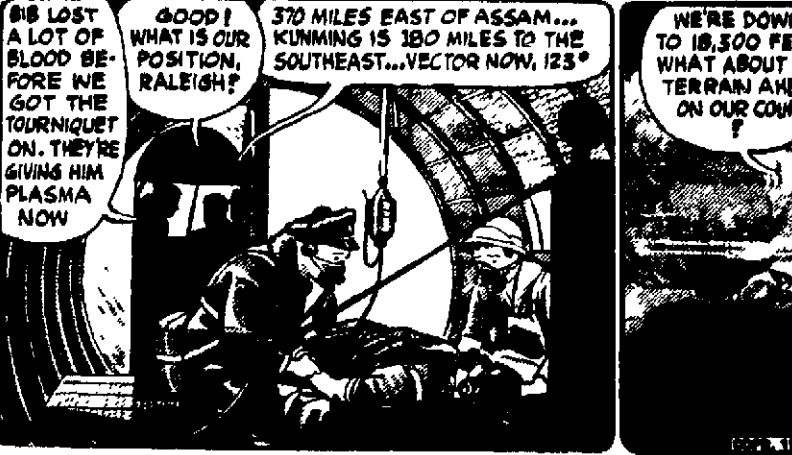
