





Uncle Ray's Corner

CENTURY AGO

The other day I saw a "history fashion parade." Perhaps 25 or 30 women put on costumes such as were worn at different times during the past century. One by one, they marched before the audience, and sometimes the people watching could not help bursting out in laughter. One merry moment came when

"a school teacher of 1895" appeared. She wore a waist with "mutton sleeves" and these made her shoulders appear very broad, indeed. These sleeves bulged out at the top in such a way that the teacher's shoulders seemed to be more than two feet wide!

The "bathing girls of 1912" were a sight to behold. They wore so much clothing that it is a wonder if they were able to swim, Two or three women showed

hats of past times. One hat was very small, and the young woman who wore it carried a tiny sun-shade over her head. The sunshade was in the form of an umbrella, but the top spread out only about 12 inches!

They had wide arching brims, and a piece of silk or lace hung from the crown down over the shoulders. A wide ribbon, of one color or another, was used to tie this bonnet, or hat, on the head. The ribbon was tied into a bow, and this added an extra decoration.
