14 MORE ARE INDICTED FOR CONSPIRACY

LANSING Mich., May 2—(AP)—A grand jury investigating allegations of graft in Michigan's legislature today charged 14 persons with conspiracy to corrupt the 1937 session—an action following a previous similar indictment of 24 individuals.

The indictment was returned by the one-man grand jury of Circuit Judge Roland W. Carr and alleged the giving and acceptance of bribes for the votes of legislators. The original indictment made identical charges.

Special Prosecutor Kim Sigler said a blanket warrant today named five men as bribe takers and the present and past members of the legislature as bribe takers to the extent of "several thousand dollars." He said the bribes involved legislation for taxation of intangible personal property such as stocks and bonds.

THIS OHIOAN PREPARES FOR FUTURE FLOODS

MANCHESTER, O., May 2—(AP)—Charles Yates built an ark in his backyard and confidently—maybe a little defiantly—awaits the coming of the next flood on the Ohio river.

Yates is a 60-year-old river veteran has seen the floods come and go and has felt their might. But when the next one comes—

"I merely will steer my ark to my house, load on all my furniture, and cruise around until the flood goes down."

Yates is reputed to have saved more than 100 homes here in Manchester during the disastrous 1937 flood. He used the simple means of tying trees to trees.

"It was shortly after that flood that he went to work on his ark, building the rather club-housed, like affair from drift wood he salvaged. Finished, he painted a name upon its side—"here 'tis—the V boat." The total cost of the craft probably is not more than \$50.

Patrol Chief Has Post-War Plans Mapped

COLUMBUS, May 2—(INS)—Presently geared to a wartime tempo, Ohio's highway patrol system, under its new, hard-hitting boss, George Mingle, casts an eye to the not-far-away future when its No. 1 job again will be the suppression of crime and protection of Ohio highways.

Mingle, selected Monday by Highway Director Hal G. Souris to replace the late Lynn Black as chief of the patrol, has a full-scale postwar program in mind for the patrol, but right now matters of the military receive priority.

Under Col. Black, the patrol won high honors for organizations of its type in contributing greatly to the war effort. Its war endeavors, miraculously accomplished with an undermanned staff, have included the escorting of military convoys thru the state, organization of volunteer home front military auxiliaries and a hundred and one other activities.

Mingle, as the patrol's major inspector, or executive officer, introduced, organized and directed virtually all of these activities. Altho he was first in line to succeed Black, his work in coordinating the patrols civilian and military duties played importantly in his selection as its new superintendent.

Probably his major war accomplishment was the establishment of the Ohio highway patrol auxiliary, a force of more than 3,000 American Legion members. Mingle is a Legionnaire himself, having served as a gunner's mate on a destroyer during the World War I.

The auxiliary, basically a civilian defense unit, has materially aided the patrol not only from a CD standpoint, but also in a number of emergencies.

FIRESTONE UNION JOINS OUSTER MOVE

AKRON, O., May 2—(INS)—The membership of Firestone local of the CIO-United Rubber Workers of America today joined forces with the Goodrich local in opposition to International President Sherman H. Dairymple.

The Firestone unit voted support of the ousting of Dairymple from the Goodrich local which later was repudiated by the international executive board.
