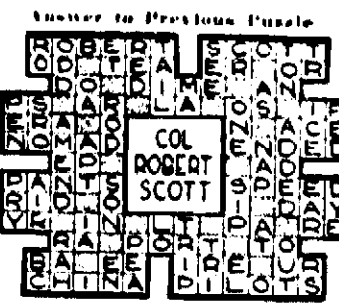

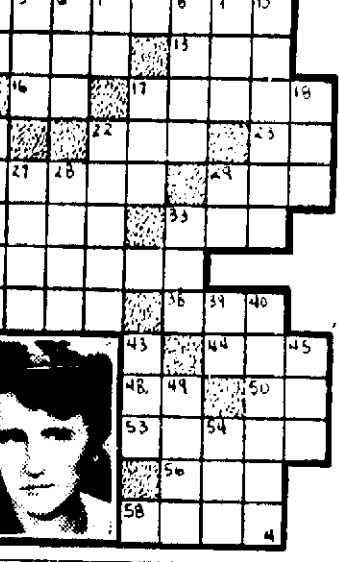

JUDGE STUDIES TOLEDO FIRM BUYS EVIDENCE IN WARD SEIZURE

CHICAGO, May 4—(INS)—Federal Judge William H. Holly was deep today in a study of briefs and evidence in the Montgomery Ward & Co. injunction case in preparation for the important decision he must make known at 10 a. m. Monday.

At the government-operated plant, union forces hastily rallied for the WLRB election Tuesday which will determine whether the United Mail Order, Warehouse and Retail Employees union (UO) is to continue as sole collective bargaining agent for Wardworkers.

Briefs for both sides were filed yesterday. The company's 70-page brief accused the government of trying to "evade the real issue," which it contended is absence of executive power to seize private property in wartime.

The government filed affidavits, designed to show that Ward's is engaged in "activities essential to the war effort."

Union leaders continued protests against the NLRB's action in allowing only seven days before the bargaining election must be held.

TOLEDO, May 4—(INS)—Purchase of the Ada waterworks was announced today by Erwin J. Ward of Siler, Rouse and Co., Toledo bond investment dealers. The plant was sold to the two Toledo firms by the Ohio Power Co.

A new organization, to be known as the Ada Water Co., with Ward as president and Edward R. Heydinger of Toledo as secretary, will operate the waterworks. It supplies the town of Ada and Ohio Northern university with water.

FOUR CHILDREN MAKING COCOA BURNED BY LYE

YOUNGSTOWN, O., May 4—(INS)—Four children, left alone in their home, were in a Youngstown hospital today with burns received when they used lye instead of sugar in making cocoa.

Their mother, Mrs. Helen Clark, 26, who was at work in a war plant at the time, was arrested on a charge of neglect.

Police reported that none of the children drank the solution, but the lye splattered their faces and bodies while they prepared the cocoa. One of the four children, Clarence, 4, was in serious condition and was given a blood transfusion.

His two brothers, James 5, and Charles 2, and his sister, Mary 3, were reported in fair condition.

Mrs. Clark told police she had paid a neighbor a dollar to care for the children and to make cocoa for them. She said the children

STRIKING BUS DRIVERS IGNORE PLEA TO RETURN

YOUNGSTOWN, O., May 4—(INS)—Striking drivers and ticket agents, who have halted operation of the Penn-Ohio Coach Lines for three days, were to conduct meetings in Youngstown and Akron today.

The 200 strikers, members of the AFL-Amalgamated Association of Street Electric Railway and Motor Coach Employes, have caused a transportation breakdown in the Cleveland - Pittsburgh - Wheeling area for 9,000 passengers daily.

Harold K. Daniels, Regional War Labor Board hearing officer, reported that efforts of his agency to end the dispute had made little in Youngstown last night. U. S. Gormley and other union officials in Youngstown last night U. S. Labor Conciliator W. W. Powell also was in Youngstown to aid in bringing the walkout to an end.
