Radio messages heretofore have been restricted to deaths in the immediate family, but now may cover births and some urgent business matters.

Messages not concerning the welfare of the immediate family will be sent by "mailbrief." This service can be obtained thru Red Cross chapters of this Marine Corps headquarters here.

DUNKIRK, May 11 — Mrs. Evelyn Towell of Dunkirk has received the Purple Heart awarded posthumously for her husband, Pfc. Orville D. Towell, who was killed in action on Jan. 26 in Italy.
