**FOSTER SAW BIT OF KENTUCKY DURING EARLY VACATION TRIP**  
The most popular "Negro songs" were written by a white man. His name was Stephen Foster.  
As a boy in Pittsburgh, Stephen learned a little about music, but he seldom saw Negroes walking on the streets of his home city. He was born in 1826, 35 years before the outbreak of the American Civil war. In those days there were some Negroes in northern parts of the United States, but not so many as there are now.  
When he was only six years old, Stephen had paid a short visit to a "slave state." With his mother and an older sister, he had boarded a steamboat
