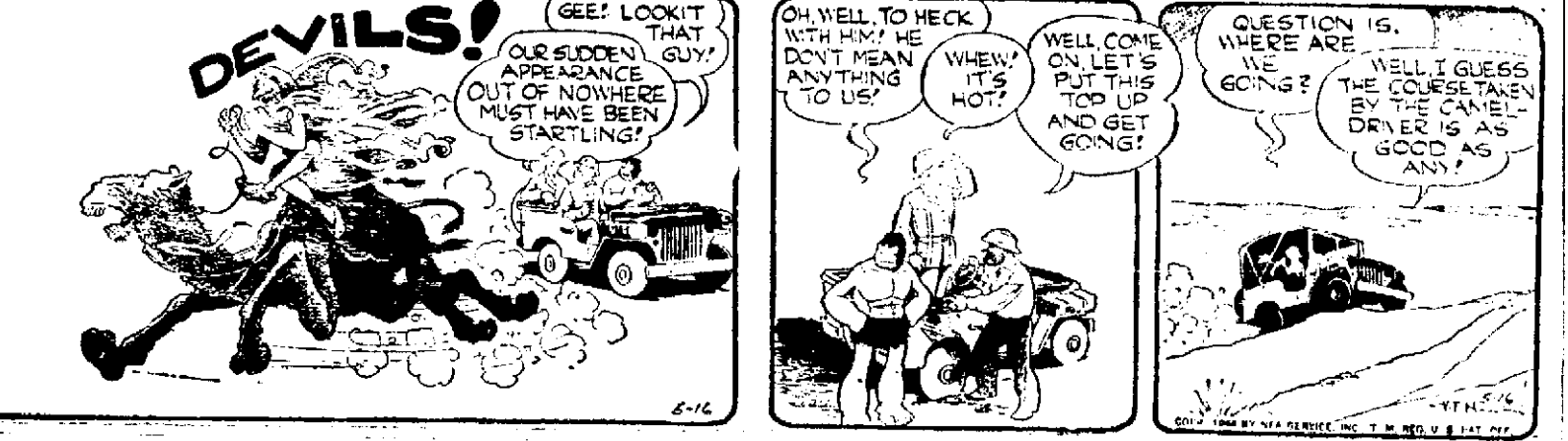

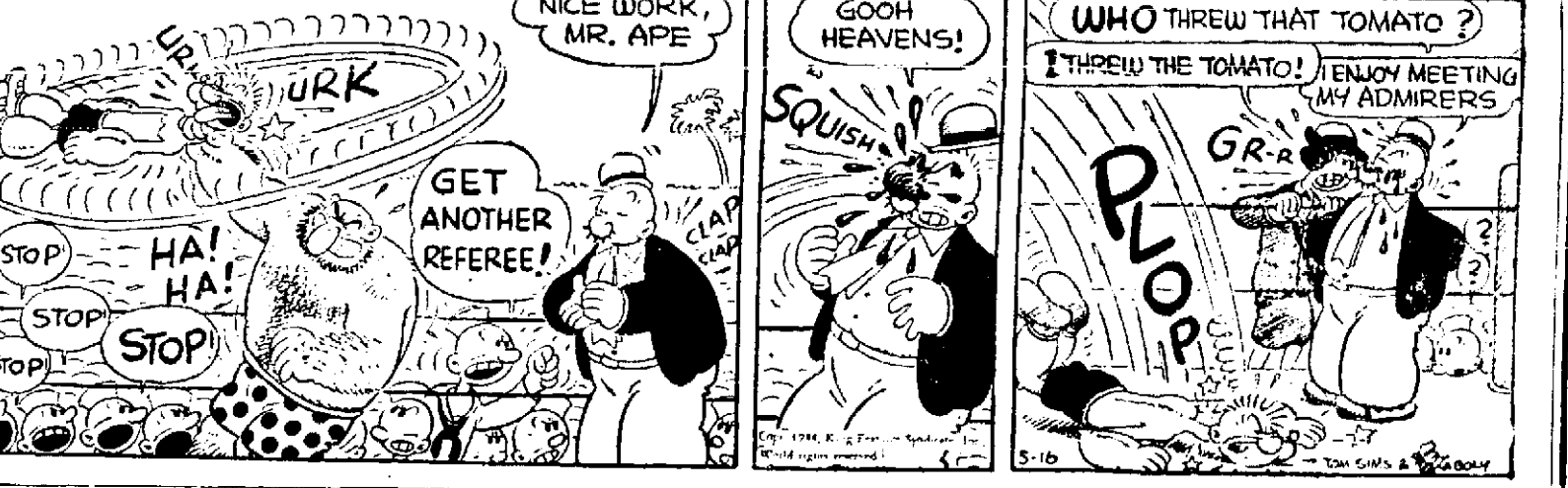

NEW DEADLOCK OF WARD'S, UNION SEEN

CHICAGO, May 16—(INS)—A new deadlock between Montgomery Ward and Co. and its CIO union employees was foreseen today with the beginning of contract negotiations, which both sides said probably would start this week.

Sewell L. Avery, Montgomery Ward board chairman, has resisted every request of the union and every directive of the War Labor Board to include in a contract the maintenance of membership clause.

Should the negotiations fail and the company defy a WLB order to include a maintenance of membership clause, as it did previously, the situation would be right back squared where it was when federal troops seized the plant for the government April 26 on President Roosevelt's executive order.

TAKES ELYRIA POST

ASHLAND, O., May 16—(AP)—Superintendent Julius E. Bohn of Ashland schools announced over the week-end he would take a similar position in Elyria this fall at a salary of \$7,000 yearly. Bohn, 48, formerly was high school principal here and in Wauseon, Kenyon and Fremont. He will succeed R. C. Matson, who retires in August.
