PLANS MADE FOR JEWISH APPEAL

Meeting Called For Thursday In Local Temple

Samuel Levin, father of a Brooklyn bombardier who served on the crew of Colm Kelly's plane, will be the speaker Thursday evening in Shaare Zedek temple in behalf of the United Jewish Appeal for Refugees and the Allied Jewish Appeal.

Sheldon Ackerman, president of the Allied Jewish Appeal, the local drive for all Jewish charities and war services, said a meeting of the budget committee and initial gift group Monday would determine the quota for the drive.

The United Jewish Appeal is the nationwide drive of American Jewry for the relief for the first victims of Hitlerism in European lands, and for the adjustment of Jewish refugees in this country through making a maximum contribution to our war effort. These programs of rescue and reconstruction are carried on respectively by the Joint Distribution Committee, United Palestine Appeal and National Refugee Service, the three agencies represented in the united campaign of the United Jewish Appeal.

Levin, the speaker, is the father of Sgt. Meyer Levin, who served with Colm Kelly in the Philippines, died later in action.




