A parade will begin at 9:15 a. m. May 30 at the Putnam House and move thru the business and residential districts to the auditorium-gymnasium. Music for the parade will be provided by the Sts. Peter and Paul parochial high school band. Included in the line of march besides the band will be the officers of the day, colors, soldiers of World War II who are home on furlough, Legionnaires and veterans auxiliary members, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, firemen, school-pupils and other citizens. A speaking program will be presented at the auditorium-gymnasium supplemented by patriotic rites.

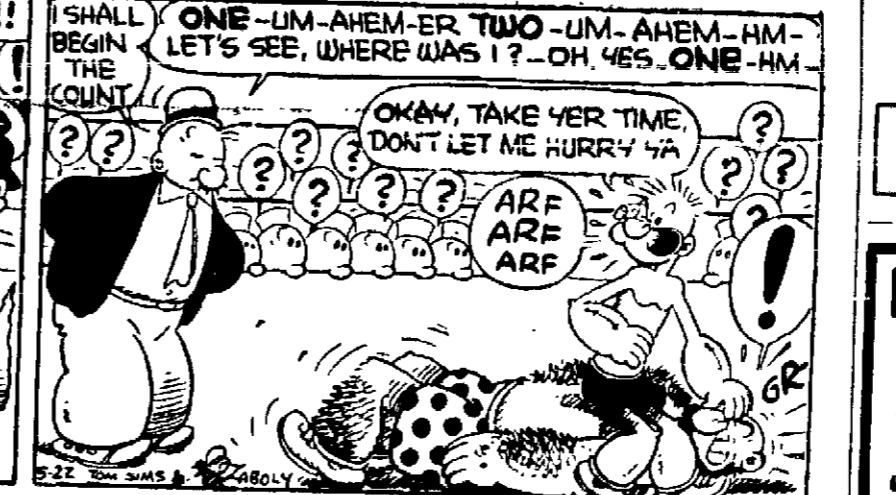

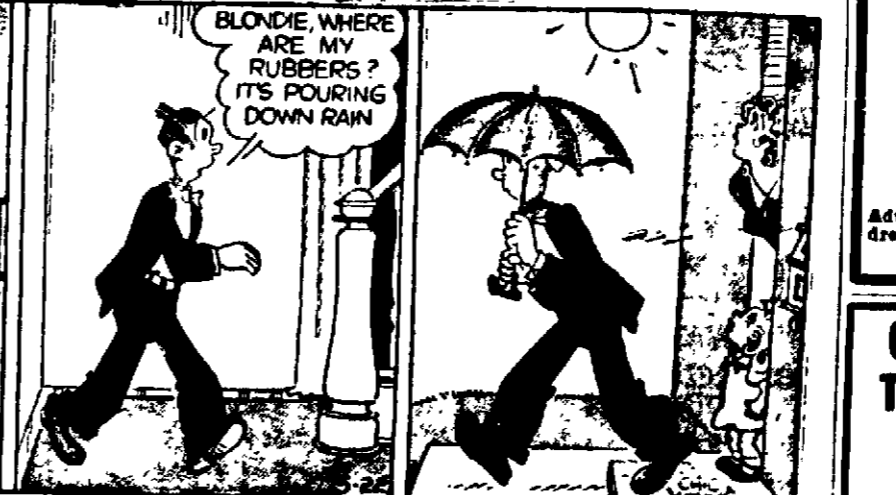

Betty Grable and Dick Powell will play the stellar roles in the musical comedy, "Springtime in the Rockies," Monday at 9 p. m. (EWT) over WABC. The full-hour dramatic show has just recently been announced the winner of the 1943 George Foster Peabody Radio Award for outstanding merit in drama.
