Near East Oil Plan Dropped

WASHINGTON, May 24—(AP)—The senate oil policy committee, it was disclosed today, has advised administration officials that a majority of the committee is opposed to the project to build a \$165,000,000 oil pipe line in the Near East.

Result of this opposition, together with criticism from a large segment of the oil industry, was reported in congressional circles to have caused the administration to virtually abandon the project.

Opposition to the proposal of Secretary of Interior Ickes to build the pipeline from the Saudi Arabian oil fields to the Mediterranean with government funds was said to be due chiefly to fear of international complications.

The entire international oil policy, it was reported in congressional circles, has been carried to President Roosevelt for a final determination.

The proposal called for development of the oil concession by a company formed by the Standard Oil of California and the Texas Company, with the pipeline to run thru Palestine.

SUCCESSOR TO REEDALL NAMED

 CLEVELAND, May 24—Harry L. Pierson, 50, of Detroit, was appointed here today as chief of the Cleveland Ordnance district to succeed Col. H. M. Reddall, who has been transferred to the Washington staff of Lt. Gen. Brehon B. Somervell, commanding general of the Army Service forces. The new ordnance district chief is a civilian.

The Cleveland Ordnance district embraces all phases of northern Ohio's production of military equipment. (Lima is in this district.)

Pierson is president of the Detroit Harvester Co., is a director of the Detroit bank, and a director of the Eaton Manufacturing Co., and of the Standard Accident and Insurance Co. He was a captain of infantry during World War I and has served since 1942 as a deputy chief for the ordnance district. He will assume his new duties Friday, replacing Col. Reddall, who left Cleveland last night for Washington.

DEMAND MADE BY WAPAK FIRM DENIED BY WLB

CLEVELAND, May 24—(INS)—A demand by the Wapakoneta Machine Co. of Wapakoneta that the CIO-United Automobile Workers be held to a voluntary agreement which provided for incentive pay was denied today by the Fifth Regional War Labor Board in Cleveland.

The regional board based the decision on the national WLB policy of refraining from ordering incentive pay plans when the matter is in dispute between companies and unions. The Wapakoneta local agreed to an incentive plan in May 1943, as a compromise for a 20-cent hourly wage increase but withdrew from the agreement in July.

In the same dispute, involving 59 employees, the board ordered rate ranges for 11 job classifications based upon the 50-cent common labor rate in metal industries in Ohio communities where no sound and tested rates have been fixed.

WILL ROGERS' BODY PLACED IN MEMORIAL CRYPT

CLAREMORE, Okla., May 24—(INS)—The body of Will Rogers lay today in a stone crypt in front of the Will Rogers memorial nearly nine years after the famous humorist crashed to his death in Alaska with his plane pilot, Wiley Post.

The body was brought to Claremore secretly by train yesterday from the Glendale, Cal. cemetery where it was buried shortly after Rogers was killed Aug. 15, 1935.

Only a small gathering of friends and relatives, fewer than a hundred, were permitted to attend the services. Among them were former Gov. Leon C. Phillips of Oklahoma and the present governor, Robert S. Kerr.

Rogers' widow was prevented from coming from her home in Glendale by illness.
