



Palm Trees Produce Sweet Drinks, Doormat Material and Sago

Our story yesterday about coconut palms left more to tell. We spoke of the food value of coconuts, but other things of value come from this tree.

The husk of a coconut grows around the nut. Usually it is from 10 to 18 inches long. Fibers from the husks are used in making rope, also for mats. Very likely you have wiped the mud from your feet more than once on a coconut-husk doormat.

The wood of a coconut tree may go into a small house or into furniture. After being sent to Europe for sale this lumber came to be called "porcupine wood." A sweet juice can be pressed from the young flower-covers of coconut palms. The juice is used of the world, and there are several as a drink in the tropies, and also kinds.
