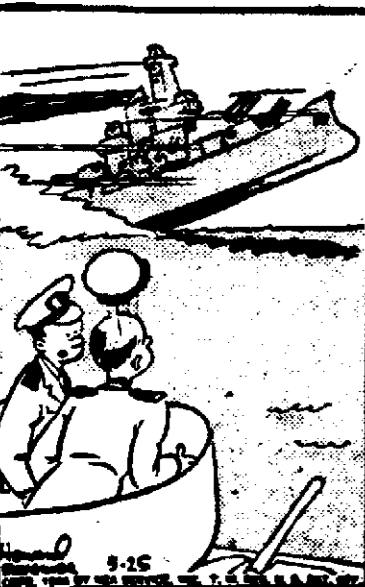
Daniel Fuchs adapted the screenplay from a play by Sutton Vane, and the music was composed by Erich Wolfgang Korngold.

**SAFETY CAMPAIGN CUTS WICHITA TOLL 53 PCT.**  
CHICAGO, May 25—(UP)—Population of Wichita, Kan., has almost doubled during the war, but traffic accidents have been reduced 53 per cent since 1940 and in 1944 the city went 197 consecutive days without a traffic fatality, says the International Association of Chiefs of Police.

Press, radio, theatres, schools and traffic courts have been utilized in a safety education program which began in 1941. Large color posters preach safety in buses, factories, schools and buildings, and are changed weekly. Signs bearing brief safety messages are installed at strategic intersections, and a large safety sign is a permanent fixture at the municipal stadium.

A police car equipped with a loud speaker gives a courteous safety lecture to pedestrians or motorists it catches disobeying the regulations.

A safety sound-movie short is shown on every theatre program, and safety movies are shown in schools and before clubs. School traffic courts, talks by policemen and safety awards are other features of the campaign.

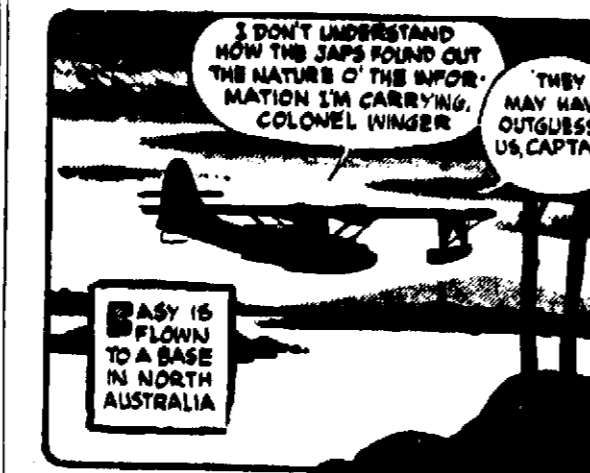

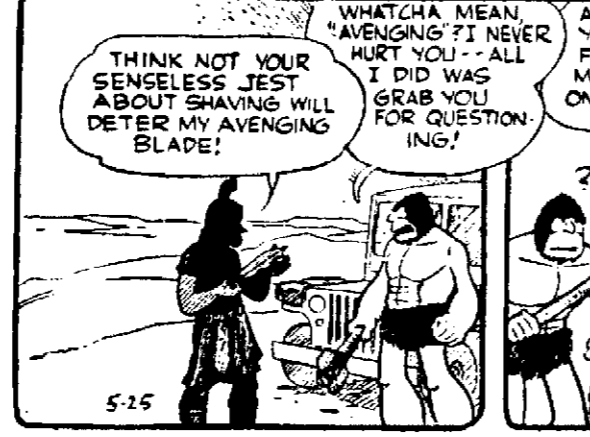

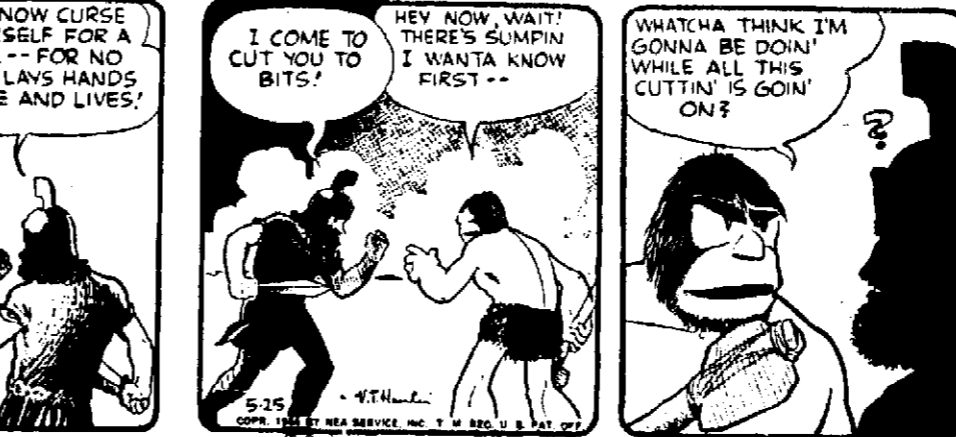

### HIGH-POWER "SPEAKER" IN PRODUCTION FOR NAVY

NEW YORK, May 25—(UP)—A new loud-speaker, resistant to shock, vibration, salt spray and gun blast, and reliable for operation in the fiercest naval battle, is now under construction for the Navy, its manufacturer has announced.

The high-powered unit, constructed principally of sheet steel and moulded plastic, was designed by the Bell Telephone Laboratories and is under production by the Western Electric Co.

With an outside diameter of 12 1/2 inches and a weight of 25 pounds, the speaker has been likened to a salad bowl in shape. It develops a sound pressure of 50 dynes per square centimeter measured at 10 feet from the speaker in open air.

The unit has three principal sections, the manufacturer said: a base with space for a transformer, terminal strip and lead-in cable; a horn, of the folded exponential type, and a magnetic unit fitted with a two-piece permanent magnet and diaphragm.
