




Sick People Used to "Call the Leech" in Oid England

More than half a century ago, a traveler came back from Ceylon with a report about the worms known as "leeches." Here, in short form, is what he said:

"In some forests and marshy jungles — especially near river banks — it is impossible to take a step without being attacked by them. They creep along the ground, seeking food. They are on every bush and tree, and often drop on the head or neck of a person passing by."
