(CLEVELAND, June 1—(AP)—Approximately 18,000 pottery employees who have been working a year or more in plants affiliated with the United States Pottery Assn today were granted one week vacations with pay.

The Regional War Labor Board announced it had reconsidered a previous order at the direction of the National War Board and had ordered one-week vacations for all employees with a year or more of service. Industry members dissented from the order.

The regional board's original order provided for a one-day vacation for each year of the employee's service up to a maximum of one week.

MIST BLANKETS DOVER STRAITS

DOVER, June 1 (AP)—Dover Strait was blanketed in mist early today, with a ceiling of very low clouds and extremely poor visibility.

Light, variable southwesterly winds ruffled the sea and kept the temperature down. The 9 a. m. reading was 55 degrees Fahrenheit.

The barometer still was falling and the outlook generally was less settled. High tides at Dover and Calais will be at 9:37 p. m. and 9:43 p. m., respectively, tonight (9:37 and 4:43 p. m. Eastern War Time), and 10:12 and 10:18 a. m. Friday (4:12 and 4:18 a. m. EWT Friday).

PIQUA, O., June 1—(UP)—Patsy Gentile, Italian-born father of Capt. Don S. Gentile, Piqua's air ace, has sold his tavern, "Patsy's Place," to Dayton interests out of deference to his son, he disclosed today.

Patsy announced that he planned a trip to California with Mrs. Gentile, Don's mother, for a short vacation after which he planned to go into another business.

Patsy said that under the conditions of the sale the same personnel he has employed for the past six years at the tavern would continue to operate it.

Don, who has destroyed 30 enemy planes in combat, his father and his mother will leave for Chicago tonight to attend a celebration there.

Don will be in Cleveland Saturday for a war bond rally. Yesterday the 23-year-old pilot flew a plane at Lockbourne Air Base at Columbus to put in his flight time.
