Uncle Ray's Corner

Japanese Were Excited When Perry Reached Bay Near Tokyo

When news of the arrival of the American fleet reached Tokyo in 1853, there was much excitement. A Japanese professor wrote about the event, saying:

"No sooner had the black ships entered the bay than signal guns and rockets were discharged. Companies of soldiers moved along the shore from one guard-house to another.

"The whole city of Yedo (or Tokyo) was in an uproar over the foreign invasion." On every side women were seen running about with children in their arms. There was a great jumble of noise, with the clatter of armed warriors marching about, the jangle of carts, the tolling of bells, and the cries of women and children. A city of more than 1,000,000 people was in alarm."

On the next day the governor of the district came to the American ships, but Commodore Perry would not talk with him.

Finally it was agreed that two Japanese princes would receive the president's letter.

The Americans fired a salute of 13 guns as 300 naval officers, sailors and marines were lowered into
