HOLLYWOOD, June 3 — (UP) — Elizabeth Heinz admitted she had received passionate love letters from ex-Count Walter Von Neudegg but denied she entertained the nobleman nude in her dressing room the night her husband and a pair of detectives rushed into her hotel suite.

"The whole thing was a frame-up on my husband's part to get divorce evidence," she testified. "I had returned from the movies and I was wearing street clothes."

The pretty wife of the pickle fortune heir accused Heinz of planting Von Neudegg in her bathroom in a Spartanburg, S. C., hotel sans clothing and of rumpling the bed in an attempt to prove she had been intimate with the count.

She said Heinz wanted to prove she was an unfit mother for their 4-year-old son, Clifford III, for whose custody they are battling.

NAZIS NOW SET JUNE 22 DATE FOR INVASION

LONDON, June 3 — (UP) — Stockholm dispatches said today that the Germans believe the Allies will attempt to seize a series of beachheads along the coast of Western Europe in advance of their all-out invasion, which may not come until June 22 or later.

The preliminary landings presumably will be patterned after that at Anzio in Italy and be designed primarily to draw off and pin down German reserves. Swedish reports said. The Germans were said to fear such landings along the coasts of Belgium, Holland and France.

June 22 was picked by the Germans as the most likely date for the main invasion because there will be a new moon and extreme high tides along the Atlantic coast at that time, Stockholm said.

CERTIFICATES AWARDED
WASHINGTON, June 3 — (AP) — Two Ohioans and an Ohio association have been awarded War Department certificates of appreciation which go to firms and individuals which have performed notable services but which are not eligible for the Army-Navy "E" award. The awards were made to Gail Feil of the B. F. Goodrich Co., of Akron; Walter Landenslager of Springfield Municipal airport and the Ohio Independent Telephone Association of Columbus.

POWDER BLAST WRECKS TOWN

LONDON, June 3 — (AP) — An ammunition train exploded Friday in an East Anglia market town, lifting roofs from adjacent houses, turning the railroad station into a shambles, and injuring a number of persons.

The fireman of the train was killed. The train, station and nearby buildings caught fire, but whether any additional fatalities occurred was not immediately known. The blast was felt 20 miles away.

Most of the town's business establishments were forced to delay opening in order to remove piles of broken glass and reassemble their stocks.

NEW BULGARIAN GOVERNMENT IS TIED TO AXIS

LONDON, June 3 — (AP) — Formation of a new Sofia government, headed by a strongly pro-Axis premier, has been announced by Berlin—a move that apparently brought Bulgaria definitely into the fold as a German puppet state.

A broadcast Transocean dispatch said the new regime was headed by Ivan Bagrianov, a former minister of agriculture who resigned three years ago after rejection of his proposal that Bulgarian farm economy be placed completely under state control, as in Germany.

Bagrianov government replaces that of Premier Dohitov, who resigned last week under pressure from Berlin to increase Bulgaria's war contribution and warnings from Moscow that Bulgaria get out of the conflict or suffer the consequences. Bulgaria is at peace with Russia.

OHIOANS BOOST EXPENDITURES FOR EATING OUT

COLUMBUS, June 3 — (UP) — Ohioans increased their expenditures more from the period of 1939 to 1943 for dining out and on personal adornment than for other kinds of retail purchases, a survey made by Ohio State university's Bureau of Business Research disclosed today.

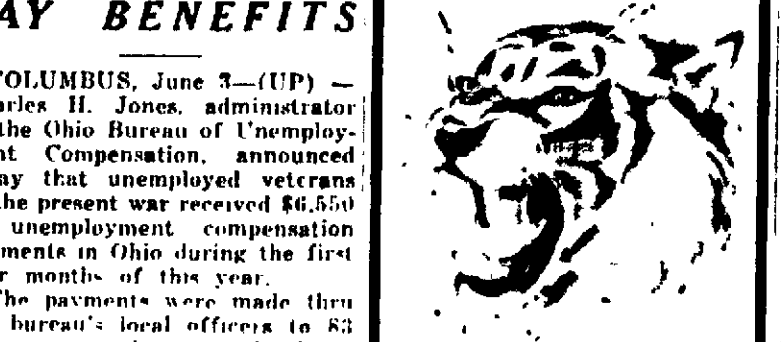
The survey revealed that the greatest relative increase in retail sales, 113 per cent, occurred in jewelry stores. Second with 80 per cent were eating and drinking places and third, with 78 per cent, were family clothing stores.

In contrast to the 80 per cent increase for "eating out," was the 29 per cent gain in sales of food stores for home consumption.

Total retail sales of all types in Ohio amounted to roughly \$3,000,000,000 in 1943 as compared with approximately \$2,500,000,000 in 1939.

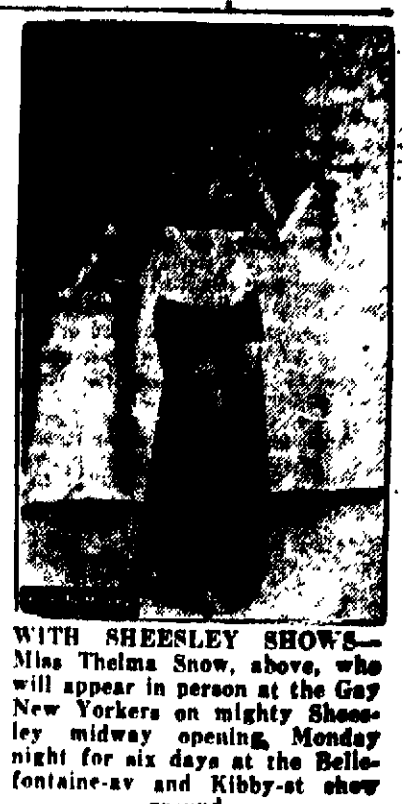
