Capt. A. M. (Archie) Adams, former Lima physician who is stationed in Italy, was recently awarded the Soldier's Medal for exceptional heroism over and beyond the call of duty, according to information received by his aunt, Mrs. B. A. Timmerman, 1561 W. High-st.

The accompanying citation reads, "for heroism at great risk of his own life upon observing an Allied fighter aircraft crash and burst into flames, this officer, F. S. Capt. A. M. Adams, rushed to the scene and heedless of intense heat, exploding ammunition and imminent danger of the aircraft exploding, made his way to the cockpit and freed the unconscious pilot and carried him to safety."

"By his courage and heroism in risking his life to save the life of another, this man has reflected great credit upon himself and the Armed Forces of the United States of America."

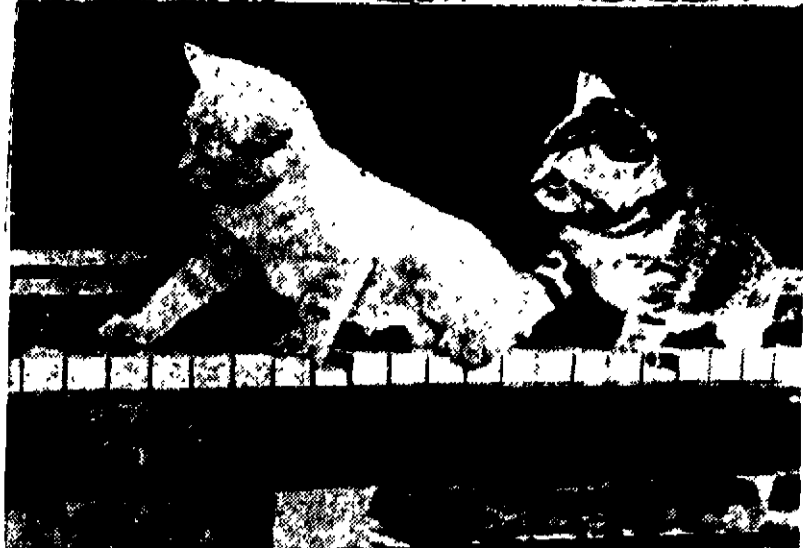

NEW \$10 'GI' WAR BOND IS PLACED ON SALE

WASHINGTON, June 3—(INS)—A new \$10 "GI" war bond which sells for \$7.50 went on sale today to service personnel throughout the nation.

Finance officers have been considering a low priced war bond since Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau reported that the war bond campaigns were not as successful, with service personnel as they should be.

Principal objection to the sale of the \$25 bond among servicemen and women, Morgenthau reported, was the installment system. The new \$10 bond can be turned over to the purchaser, restricted to servicemen and women, as soon as the paymaster receives \$7.50.

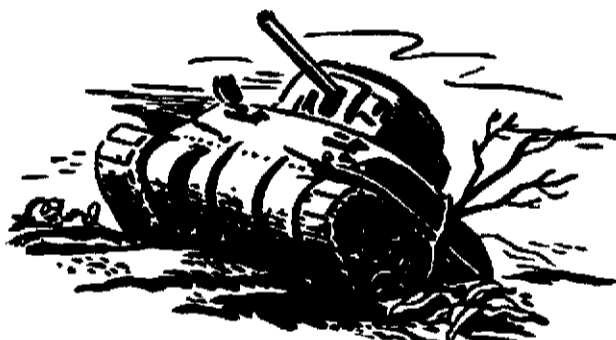

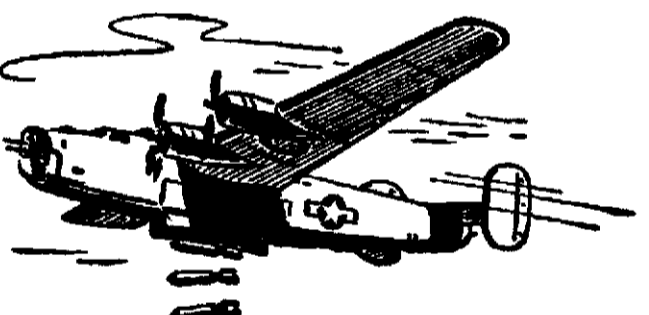

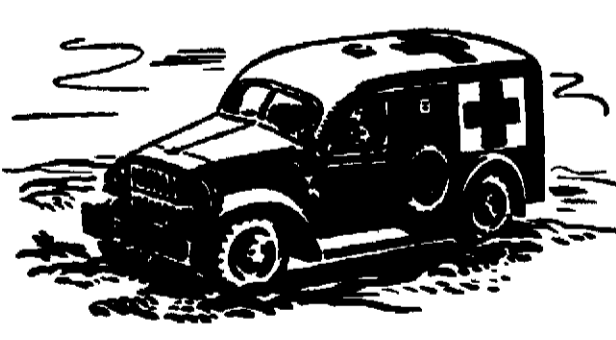
