CAPTAIN TO BE FIRST WITNESS IN SEX TRIAL

SANTA ANA, Calif., June 9 (UP)—Capt. Morrison J. Wilkinson, Jr., the dapper air force pilot accused of sexual misconduct, bigamy and theft, was scheduled to be the first witness today as the defense opened its case before a 10-man court martial board.

The prosecution rested after Provost Marshall Major Carl E. Myers testified the former Washington, D. C., flier admitted to him that he had been intimate with Caprice Capron, 17-year-old Earl Carroll dancer.

Another teen-age night-club dancer, Dean Stull, described yesterday how she resisted Capt. Wilkinson's advances and then walked three or four miles home when she escaped from his car.

Capt. Wilkinson, a veteran of the 14th Pursuit Group in China, pleaded innocent to the charges which include theft of a gold watch from his first wife, bigamy and seven sex offenses in as many days.

THREE MUSICIANS FINED

CHICAGO, June 9 (AP)—The American Federation of Musicians' executive board yesterday denied appeals of three veteran members of the Cincinnati symphony orchestra from union fines and suspensions. Leo Cluesmann, national secretary, announced the decision in the cases of Rueben Lawson, who was fined \$750 and suspended three months; William Morgan Knox, \$2,500 and six months; and Hobart Schoch, \$250. The penalties against the violinists were effective last May 15.

LAKE VICTIM IS FOUND

SANDUSKY, June 9 (AP)—The Coast Guard yesterday recovered from Lake Erie the body of Homer Price, 58, who drowned when a cabin cruiser capsized last Saturday. The body of another victim was found and two other members of Price's fishing party were rescued last Sunday. All were from Columbus.

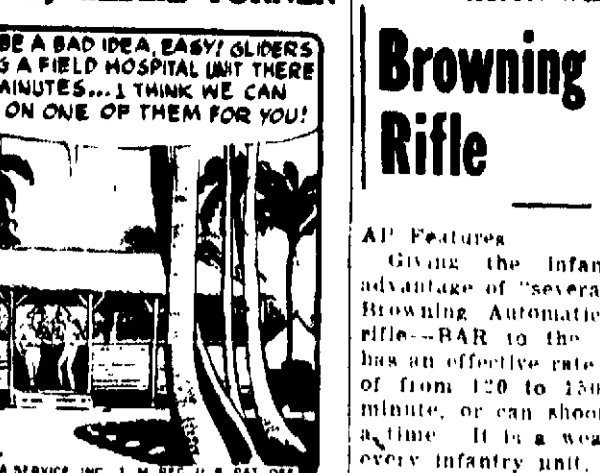
