CLEVELAND, June 10-(AP) -Office of Price Administration investigators conducting a probe of alleged ration board frauds to RETAIL BAKERS day held for questioning a man they described as a "small peddler"

The man was taken into custody vesterday after investigators reported purchasing from him 40 of the C-3 stamps missing from Cuyahoga-co's largest ration In addition detectives reported

they are searching for another man, also believed to be a peddler of the stamps. Both will be questioned regarding larger distribmtors, the officers said.

A Cleveland tire dealer, who already has been questioned once in connection with the probe, also was taken into custody yesterday and will be requestioned today, the investigators disclosed.


