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FDR, Hull Welcome Iceland as Republic

WASHINGTON (U.P.)—Pres. Roosevelt and Secretary of State Cordell Hull Saturday night personally welcomed Iceland into the family of nations as a free and independent republic. The occasion was the rebirth of the oldest surviving Republic, which dates back to the year 930. In a telegram to the new Icelandic president, Sveinn Bjornson, Mr. Roosevelt expressed his

"heartiest congratulations on your election to the high office of president of the republic of Iceland and my best wishes and those of the people of the United States for the continued prosperity of the Icelandic nation."

The new republic was proclaimed Friday by the Althing, Iceland's 1014 year old parliament. Bjornson, who has served as regent for the king of Denmark since 1940, was elected the first president today.

UNCLE RAY'S CORNER
"Hand Cannon" Was An Ancestor of Big Modern Guns
War pictures show us "big guns" which are being moved about, or which are in action. These are sights to see, and they make mighty explosions when they are fired.

It is a long distance from a modern cannon to the early "hand cannon" with its small barrel. Yet the hand cannon may be called a great-grandfather of the present-day big gun.

Six hundred years have rolled by since men in western Europe began to fire cannon which contained gunpowder. Some of these cannon had short barrels but wide mouths. They were of the "mortal" type, and could hurl their "cannon balls" only a few hundred feet.

The wide-mouthed cannon were too clumsy to be moved around very well, but some soldiers had short guns which could be held in the hands. These may remind us of present-day "bazookas," since they were little more than straight barrels. The bullet, however, was sent forward by a single explosion of gunpowder, and the principle of the rocket was not used.

Those hand cannon were short. Sometimes the barrel was only two feet in length. In other cases it was as much as three or four feet long.

The custom was to fasten the barrel to a strip of wood, so it could be held more easily. Powder was poured in through the muzzle of the gun. The gunpowder known at that time was very weak, and a great deal of it had to be used.

After the powder went into the barrel, the shot was dropped in. For many years it was common to use small stones as the missiles to be fired. Later came balls made of iron, lead and brass.

The barrel of a hand cannon at first had a hole, or bore, only half a, inch or an inch wide. In later times some of the barrels were made with bores of two inches or more.

The larger hand cannon were handled by at least two men. There was a small hole in the metal barrel, just above the part
