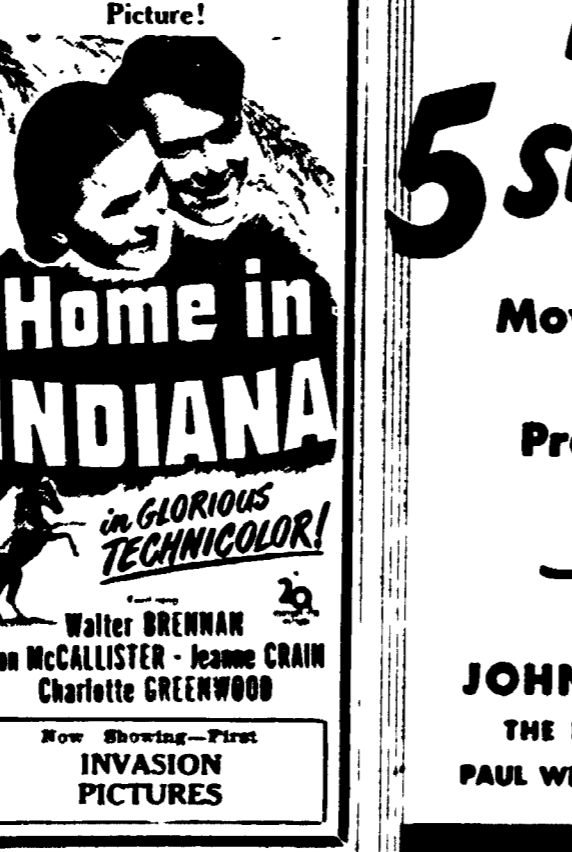
Before cleaning your car up holsters, find out whether the cushions are padded with a rubber compound; if they are, too strong a cleaning fluid may destroy them.

But huge amounts of cotton are being bought in June to go overseas to put occupied countries in working order as soon as the Army takes over. Overseas allotments of cloth were based on the first six months' production but the actual allocation didn't take place till late in May, leaving most of the buying for June. That means low-cost cottons will be hard to find for the present, with as much as 40 per cent of some types, such as poplins and broadcloth, on their way out of the country.

That's all the more reason, WI textile experts point out, for using the cloth on hand for the homefolks to make low-cost clothes with standards of durability. Without a strong incentive for manufacturers you might
